SCRIPTUAL REFLECTION:

OF PROPHETS AND LISTENERS



"Don't let anyone mislead you, for many will come in My name, claiming, 'I am the Messiah,' and saying, 'The time has come!' But don't believe them" (Luke 21:8).

More in Nigeria than here in the US, many wake up from bad dreams and decide that God has called them to be His mouthpiece. They deceive and lead many gullible Christians astray. David Koresh (Branch Davidians of Waco, Texas) comes to mind. But while outlandish claims of speaking for God may be rare in our society, many are still led astray by both those who say they speak for God and those who say they have nothing to do with God.

In our first reading today (Deuteronomy 18:15-20) Moses encouraged the Israelites to be careful who they listened to, and once they found out that the one they listen to spoke God's words, they must indeed listen and obey. That's no easy task then or now.

What voices do you listen to? Deuteronomy 18:10 warns against consulting fortune tellers and soothsayers, consulting ghosts or spirits, casting of spells, horoscope, etc. Nowadays, we hear of the increasing number of youth (and even adults) who dabble in all these negative forces out of boredom and curiosity. And the effects will remain long after the boredom and curiosity wear off. We reap the fruits we sow. Sadly, many listen to these negative voices that lead them astray and turn deaf ears to the voices that will lead them to safety and to God.

May we, like Moses, be true messengers of God – yes, priests and nuns are not the only ones who speak the word of God; we all do so in different ways. And may we who listen, be guided by God's wisdom and the spirit of discernment; and may we heed the true prophets of God. Amen.

ARRIVAL OF OUR NEW ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Fr. Anthony Mbanefo, MSP, our new Associate Pastor, arrives this week.



His appointment is effective February 1, 2015. I know we're curious about who he is and what he's been doing since his ordination. Here's a little info on him, while we await his arrival. You'll be hearing more from the horse's mouth when he arrives. He was ordained on July 1, 1992 at our seminary in Nigeria. After the Associate normal one-year pastoral experience, he was assigned

Pastor to our Formation House in Nigeria for a year. He was then assigned to our Gambian mission in 1994. In 2005 he was assigned to the USA Region. He worked with one of our priests in Beaumont Diocese for one year before being assigned to Austin Diocese. He's coming to us from the Diocese of Savannah, Georgia. Coincidentally, Fr. Daniel will be taking over from him.

From personal experience, Fr. Anthony is a sincere, humble and spiritual priest, among other things. He has a strong pastoral zeal and cares for people. He has written some spiritual books and articles, including The Wisdom of the Cross and The Seven Words on the Cross. Fr. Anthony speaks Spanish fluently. Every priest, in his own unique way, enriches the parish he's sent to work with and helps build God's people up. I'm confident that Fr. Anthony's coming will enrich St. Bart's as a parish and enrich the lives of our parishioners.





This Monday, February 2nd, is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. It was ancient Jewish custom that on the 40th day after childbirth, parents brought their infant to the Temple to present the child to the Lord and to purify the mother. Luke's gospel highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited

Messiah and praised God for being able to see and experience such a marvel in their lifetimes.

Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day which were to be used in the ceremonies, rituals, and processions throughout the church year. Thus, February 2nd, is also known as Candlemas Day. There will be a candle procession at the beginning of our 9 a.m. Mass this Monday. You may bring candles for home devotions to be blessed.

ST. BLAISE'S FEAST DAY: This Tuesday, February 3rd, is the Feast of St. Blaise. We will have the **Blessing** of Throats only during the 7 a.m. and 9 a.m. Masses.
