# NCRWF September 2017 Newsletter - Campaign Precinct Operations by Waskah Whelan

Re: CFRW re-organization plan to eliminate the Republican Women Federated County Clubs in San Diego and Southern California

#### Proposal:

To address the issue of decreased CFRW membership in California, the CFRW Executive Board has proposed a plan to re-organize Southern California Federated Clubs. All the Southern California Federated County Clubs will be closed down and the large majority of their money forfeited to the CFRW. California will be run by eight Regional Managers that report directly to CFRW. Local Clubs will function the same as they do now, but governed directly by CFRW. The CFRW plan states members will not have to attend County meetings and will save money by paying no dues. (\$2.60 per year per member.) They feel attending county meetings is a burden on the members that can result in a lack of officers. note: only Southern California has County Clubs. Southern Division will also be closed as well as Central and Northern Divisions.

#### Response:

The CFRW Executive committee should reconsider putting this proposal to a vote at the Monterey Convention on October 7-9 because all viewpoints from Southern California clubs and members were not addressed in the CFRW planning meetings and because these meeting were kept secret from the members. We feel the committee did not have enough accurate information about County clubs to push this proposal through so quickly and our membership was disadvantaged to only learn of the proposal details after the fact with no opportunity to influence the final vote.

The vote will be in Northern California in Monterey. It will cost \$600-\$800 per person to attend and give input. You will have two minutes on Friday, October 7 to state your position, but not to the General Session on Saturday!

Southern California County clubs pay over 60% of all dues paid to CFRW, yet, had no representation on this board. We were kept in the dark on this issue even though we are the only ones affected by the proposal.

How does eliminating the County Clubs help elect more Republicans and attract more members to join? CRFW infers this will happen, but does not state how. It is questionable to assume that fewer face to face connections with the public will result in more women joining CFRW

#### **Elections:**

We have had the San Diego County Federation of Republican Women club since 1925 and we have been very successful in helping win elections for Republicans even in a blue state like California. San Diego is the largest city in US with a Republican mayor.

California is not like other states. The style of campaigning and winning for Republicans in Northern California doesn't resemble what we do in Southern California. All politics is local and forcing us to run our election efforts like Northern California will not result in winning campaigns.

#### Local Clubs:

Eight Regional Directors will be the lone support for the clubs under this plan, but they will have no Board and no Budget. Managers are only eligible to serve if they are already on the CFRW Board which will severely limit the number of candidates for the job. Some Regional Directors will be in charge of more than one county. One person cannot possibly organize and carry out the many tasks needed to set up and staff a County Fair booth, for instance.

All 20 clubs will have to organize and implement everything individually. This wastes time and is not productive.

#### SDCFRW gives support to their local clubs and the San Diego Republican Party in many ways:

Training of Club Officers

Acting as a Resource and Support for Club Officers during their terms of office Organizes and disseminates information to the local clubs - Coordinates county-wide events Support for County Scholarships, both for colligates and vocational workers Gives access to the press for informative articles on local Republican Women Provide funds for radio ads to support women during Breast Cancer Awareness month Resource information and new ideas given to clubs for their members through SDCFRW

County Newsletter, Facebook Page, Web Page, emails and monthly meetings.

Organization of election activities and volunteers - advertising candidate events to all our members

Provides support and hosts a county forum for candidates to address multiple clubs, distribution of signs and other election materials including volunteer sign ups.

Organizing of voter registration efforts for New Citizen and other Community Events

Acting as a public advocate for Republican efforts to defeat Democrat proposals such as the

Car Tax Plan.

Organizing setup and staffing of San Diego County Fair including clubs and paid workers. Preparing

- payroll and making payment to College Republican workers. \$2500 for fair + \$2000 for workers. Who will pay this?
- Outreach program to all San Diego County College Republican clubs, providing clubs with best practices and successful membership drives and fund raising ideas.
- Providing detailed information on local, state and national Legislation and organizing "Action Items" for members
- Paying for and securing insurance for SDCFRW clubs. Who would make these arrangements if the County didn't exist?
- Forum for motivational Speakers and to give clubs new ideas for their own programs.

  Gives timely access to experts on current events, reports from Republican Party officials and elected representatives. Addressing 20 clubs separately on important issues quickly is not feasible.
- Forum for exchange of ideas and connecting with other club officers and members.

  County meetings and board meetings are where contacts are made and friendships formed with the other clubs.
- Outreach to other voting groups through radio ads and Republican literature
  Organizing support from all the clubs to fund a Caring for America project during the
  year. Combining club donations allows for a meaningful sized donation such as the
  \$20,000 raised for the Track Chair.

#### Summary:

- New Regional Areas will not operate under the Roberts Rules system of a President and Board type organization. Shirley Mark announced that the Directors will not have a board and no budget. To be eligible they must have already served on the state CFRW board at least one year. So we will not be "electing" the people's choice. It will be the choice of CFRW. If no one is eligible then the CFRW President appoints your Director. Managers manage and Directors direct. Just as in business, they answer and report to the power above them. They are not reporting to you or asking for your ideas.
- Under the Roberts Rules system, Presidents don't rule, they preside and with an elected board come to decisions that take into consideration all points of view. The elected board acts to protect the membership. Presidents cannot act without the board's permission and the board will step in if the President oversteps their authority. Who will protect the membership under this new plan? To whom is the Director answerable? What if you don't want the Director they assign to you? What protection is given so you have a voice in this process?
- Without our county clubs and events, the local clubs will exist in isolation. After one year, members will not even know, let alone meet the Presidents of other clubs. There will be no meetings, no events, no County webpage, no Facebook page and no roster. We will be strangers, separate and isolated from each other. This lack of connection will result in fewer members and less involvement in election activities. Isolation is a key reason for lack of effort and malaise.

The number one reason San Diego County has been successful is our connection to one another. We support each other and our goals have always been closely aligned.
