

Requisitos Para Inscribirse Para Clases De Catecismo (comienzan el 6 de septiembre)

Los requisitos para matricularse incluyen los siguientes (1) que los padres y sus niños hagan el compromiso asistir regularmente a una de las Misas del fin de semana acá en Santa María a través del año (2) que la familia se comprometa a practicar la corresponsabilidad (de su tiempo, talento y tesoro) a su parroquia de Santa María. (3) que la familia sea registrada en nuestra parroquia de Santa María. Si no está inscrito, tome ahora un formulario de inscripción del fondo de la iglesia, llenarlo completamente y ponerlo en el cesto durante la colecta en la misa o póngalo en el buzón de la oficina parroquial.

Often asked Questions About the RCIA

What is the RCIA? The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a program designed to help non-Catholics as well as non-practicing Catholics to learn about Catholicism through a series of weekly classes, discussions, prayer times and step wise religious rites. Over the September-April period (2017-2018) the RCIA program helps participants grow in faith and knowledge of God, Jesus Christ and His Church as they consider becoming Catholic. The RCIA involves praying, learning teachings of the Bible and of the Church, discussing how they apply to our lives, participating in prayerful religious ceremonies ("Rites") which will be explained beforehand.

If I start in September, when might I become a Catholic?




Typically, a person joining the RCIA in September will complete their full initiation into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil which

this year is March 30, 2018. But the process could be months later for those requiring an annulment.

What if I go through the RCIA and choose not to become Catholic? There is no obligation to become a Catholic nor will you be pressured to do so. Each individual's stages of growth differs; some even take a few years to learn about Catholicism before deciding to become Catholic; some never feel called to do so. If a person is unsure whether they want to become Catholic, they are very welcome to attend RCIA as they deliberate.

Who Joins The RCIA? People from all sorts of religious backgrounds join the RCIA. Some have been baptized in another Christian religion, some have never been baptized. Some have been practicing Christians for many years, some come with little or no religion in their background. And some are already Catholic but are seeking a greater understanding of our faith. Religious Education Classes Soon to Begin




Parents and students are notified that our classes begin at 6 PM this Wednesday, 9/6. After Masses this weekend and next, pre-registration is taking place in the parish hall.

Parents are reminded that both "Mass and Class" go hand in hand with religious formation. This is also the time for parents to recall that Vatican Council II teaches parents form a "domestic church". Consequently, at this time of the year, parents are to re-commit to attending weekly one of our parish's weekend Masses with their children and to do so throughout the year.
