How time flies! It has been a whole entire year since Susan and I moved to Elkins and became First Church's pastoral family. We want to thank each of you, from the bottom of our hearts, for your love, support, acceptance, assistance and mutual ministry. We could not be happier! And we are so very proud of the vital ministry that First Church is engaged in!

Annual Conference has once again come and gone. We have officially been appointed by the bishop for our 2nd year of ministry together. We can't wait to continue to move forward in ministry and mission together. Again, thanks so much for opening your arms wide and inviting us right into your lives!

When I was in seminary, I came across the theologian J.I. Packer, who wrote an epic work titled Knowing God. It is a masterpiece, and I highly recommend it. As Mr. Packer wrote in his work:

What makes life worthwhile is having a big enough objective, something which catches our imagination and lays hold of our allegiance, and this the Christian has in a way that no other person has. For what higher, more exalted, and more compelling goal can there be than to know God? (Knowing God, 1973, Downer's Grove, IL, InterVarsity Press).

In an interview with Christianity Today in 1988, Mr. Packer shared the following:

When I came to North America, I found that most churches, pastors, seminaries, colleges, and para-church agencies and agents were in the grip of this secular passion for successful expansion in a way I had not met in England. Church-growth theorists, evangelists, pastors, missionaries, and others all spoke as if...numerical increase is what matters most...[and]...numerical increase validates ministries as nothing else does..."

Later in the interview, Mr. Packer shared that one of the unhappy outcomes of this thinking was that "big and growing churches were viewed as far more significant than others" which in many cases led to clergy leaving the ministry for secular employment in "disillusionment and bitterness." He concluded his interview with these wonderful words; "Faithfulness, godliness, and loving service are the divine measure of real success in ministry" (p. 15, August 12, 1988). I have shared this belief and continue to use it as a guiding factor in the ministry that Christ has called me to do!

Let's make these great goals our focus as a church for this next year: faithfulness, godliness and loving service. With such an emphasis – a "divine measure of real success" - God will certainly take care of all the rest! Praise be to God!

MUSIC NOTES

As we move into July and August, the ringing and singing choirs take a well-deserved break from the worship and rehearsal schedule. Soloists and ensembles will be offering their gifts for the 11:00 service.

The Chancel Choir sang two songs in June that have meaning beyond the music itself. "Let's Just Praise the Lord/Get All Excited" is a pairing of tunes by Bill and Gloria Gaither from the 1970s. They have been in our library for a long time – since the time of Jack Basil's directing – in fact, the music is permanently out of print. Though one might consider these tunes out-of-step with 2018, yet there was an excitement in the moment of that music. Hollie Pritt flawlessly sang a solo verse that was crowded with words. Paraphrased, the text speaks to our talking about things that are not particularly important in the scheme of faith. But what we do profess, plain and simple and glorious, is that "Jesus Christ is still the King of Kings".

The second anthem that morning was "In Christ Alone", written by Stuart Townend and Keith Getty, and published in 2002. It has been in our library since 2009, and we return to it, usually annually. [It was part of a service of celebration of life in 2012. Music can sometimes be a piercing trigger for memories.] Our arrangement has an unyielding forward tilt into spiritual and vocal power, and it also has a rich and often poetic text:

No guilt in life, no fear in death, this is the power of Christ in me; From life's first cry, to final breath, Jesus commands my destiny. No power of hell, no scheme of man can ever pluck me from His hand; 'Til he returns or calls me home, here in the power of Christ I stand.

Sometimes, in our warm-up rehearsal, we hear and feel a vigor to the music that is not our own making. Individual thoughts and events and emotions coincide to create music that is more than we are – Ellis Conley called it synergy. What we believe is that the Holy Spirit finds us in that moment and makes us greater than the sum of our vocal parts. We know and recognize the moment, and it usually is not something that we can recreate on our own. We watch together, we breathe together, we feel God's presence together, and in those musical moments, we *are* One in the Spirit. A moment in time, consecrated forever.
