## AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

### Last Weekend for Tannenbaum Forest

An icy Saturday, Dec. 14 led to closures, and the Tannenbaum Forest was no exception. But as a result, the Tannenbaum Forest had twice as many visitors on Sunday and the village of Amana was very busy indeed.

This weekend, Dec. 20 - 22 is the last weekend the Tannenbaum Forest is open.

It will be open Friday, Dec. 20 from noon - 7 p.m.; Saturday, Dec. 21 from 10 a.m. - 7 p.m. and Sunday, Dec. 22 from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Santa will be in the Forest only on Saturday from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. He's a busy guy so Saturday, Dec. 21 is his last day in the Forest.

Remember those of you who have trees in the Forest, please take down your tree Sunday, Dec. 22 from 5 - 8 p.m. or after Christmas, Thursday, Dec. 26 from 9 a.m. - 8 p.m. or Friday, Dec. 28 from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. No Monday, Dec 23 clean-up hours are planned as folks will be preparing for their own holiday. Volunteers are needed to help take down decorations in the Forest Thursday so if you have an hour to spare come on down to the Festhalle.

### Amana Community Christmas Past

In chatting with friends and family we recalled some Amana Colony Christmases past. Looking at old copies of the Amana Society Bulletin and Willkommen, here's our "Do you remember?"

- On Dec. 17, 1941 a Christmas program was sponsored by the Amana Young Men's Bureau at the High School Auditorium in Middle. It was a fund raiser for the AYMB and featured the very first performance of a new community choir, the Amana Young's Men's Chorus. This group of 20 men was led in song by Mrs. Rosalie Lowe (then the High School music teacher). A play called "The Empty Room" was presented by a small cast of Amana residents, and a speech was given by the club's president, Martin Dickel and by the Amana Society president, Dr. Henry Moerschel.

- According to the Dec. 14, 1941 minutes of the AYMB which met that night at the West Amana Clubhouse (minutes collected/ compiled by Cliff Trumpold) gift boxes containing candy, chewing gum, stationery, a pen and a pack of cards were sent to young Amana men away in training for the service in 1941. Gifts were sent to: Lt. Carl Moershel in Texas, Cpl. Harry Lehardt in CA; Privates Louis Schmieder, LA; Walter Hess, FL; Henry Solbrig, TX; Ernest Bahndorf, LA; Ray Baumgartel, MO; George Erzinger, MA; George Schuerer, IL.

- On Nov. 20, 1945, members of the AYMB voted to send \$2 money orders to each of the Amana men in service as shipping boxes was not permitted at that time to the Pacific of China-Burma theaters of war. They also voted to raise \$250 for the erection of memorial to be placed at the Amana High School in honor of those Amana men who had died in WWII. Carl Eichacker, Secretary of the School Board, reported that the Amana School Board agreed to support this memorial and it's placement on school grounds.

- The Candy Kitchen on Court Avenue in Marengo advertised its "double malteds" along with an assortment of Christmas candies in the December 1947 Amana Bulletins. All retail stores in Marengo would be open Saturday nights in December of 1947 for Christmas shopping.

- According to the first Amana Society Bulletin of 1948, the annual husking of the corn harvest was completed just before Christmas. Thanks were given to all who had worked so hard in December to get it done.

- December 17, 1948 a Christmas party was held at the Amana Clubhouse with Harry Geiger master of ceremonies introducing AYMB president, Carl Selzer. Special egg nog was served by Billy Metz. Elmer Dittrich and his "all girl chorus" performed. Santa Clauses Harry Wendler and Bill Ackerman handed out gifts to the wives and girlfriends.

- The year Amana folks first tasted deer? 1953 was the first legal hunting season for deer in Iowa. A few Amana families prepared deer loin or steak for Christmas dinner that year.

- Winners of the 1963 Christmas lighting contest were: Glenn Hoppe, (west end Homestead), George Scheuer (East Amana) and Martin Fels, (mid-town Homestead).
Final designs for the new high school addition to Lakeside Elementary were shown at the Amana High Christmas concert of 1968 in Middle Amana. In the fall of 1968 the Amana community had passed a bond issue of \$250,000. The vote was 423 "yes" to 32 "no." The addition to the Lakeside Elementary consists of high school classrooms, a home economics room, industrial arts room, band and music room, teacher's work room, superintendent's office, school office and library for the Amana High School. Two moveable units were to add classroom space. Construction was completed in 68-69 by Schoff Construction of Lisbon, Iowa. The new high school wing opened in August of 1969.
Bertha Wilson's Christmas programs at the Lakeside Elementary School of 1965 to 1971 were the talk of the community. One notable performance in the new auditorium featured a living Christmas tree made of students dressed in green felt wreath shaped tops, standing next to one another on a series of risers on the stage. Arranged in the shape of a pine tree, some students were dressed in gold and others in red to appear as the decorations. They sang "O Tannenbaum" and "Deck the Halls." Principal Swanson dressed as Santa Claus handed out gifts to each child after the concert.
Julie Wilson introduced the use of pop songs in 1975 when high schoolers entertained the elementary school children at a school Christmas program by singing a popular tune by Simon and Garfunkel, "The Sound of Silence." After the performance Wilson was asked to explain the song to the Amana School Board who voted that it was ok to sing such songs in the schoolhouse.
In 1984 Emmaline Bendorf advertised The Christmas Room as Iowa's first shop dedicated to Christmas. The store was located in the Bendorf's converted garage, remodeled entirely The Christmas Room (now The Noble Stone.)
Also in 1984 Oehl Plumbing and Heating held their Christmas party at Zum Burghof. The Ronneburg's "new pub" was now open Monday - Saturday till 10 p.m. serving "short orders and brats" with beers on tap and cocktails, according to a November ASI Bulletin advertisement.
The Prelude to Christmas took place in Decem

ber of 1985. That means that next year will be our 40th anniversary. It did not include the Tannenbaum Forest which is believed to have been started sometime after 1991.

- In December 1989 during Prelude to Christmas, Amana's new "winter festival" called "Winter Carnival" was announced. It was held January 13 with a snow date on Jan. 20. Speed skating competitions on the Lily Lake, the opening of a cross country skiing trail and a parade were planned.
Der Leder Haus (owned by Tony Patti) next to Blackbird Pottery on Amana's main street offered Amana residents 25% off all handmade leather belts for Christmas 1990.
Christmas at the Amana Heritage Museum 1991, Prelude to Christmas, a special program by Caroline Ertz and Mary Burgher with help from others will be offered at the annual Prelude to Christmas celebration the first weekend of December.
The "Wreaths for Wishes" silent auction at the Tannenbaum Forest 2010 helped raise money for the Make a Wish Foundation. According to forest chairman, Jon Childers, over 5,630 patrons visited the forest in 2010 and raised more than \$5,000 after expenses. Childers thanked Brandi Jones of the Amana Heritage Museum, Terry Roemig if the Kitchen Sink and Stephanie Brandenburg of Fern Hill for their help. He noted that the "top year" to date at the forest which was 2006 with over 6,500 guests.
A Soup supper was held the Amana Church, Dec. 18, 2016. Chicken noodle soup and a Christmas Cookie buffet were offered along with other light dinner refreshments following the annual Sunday School program at the Amana Church at 4:30 p.m.
