



Case Study for High End one-off bespoke build & finish 200 Guests

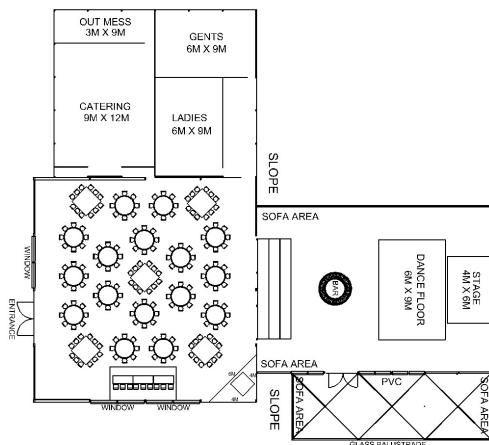
Our clients' wish list:

The bride and groom had employed a very experienced and imaginative party planner to design their wedding, so their own ideas were given star treatment. The clients wanted to use the house as a backdrop throughout the different areas and were starting the event indoors for drinks on arrival. Key requirements for the main event were, a square dining room, a night club for after party, built in toilets and a comfortable outdoor smoking and chill-out area.



The Venue:

The chosen venue featured a stunning—and large! Historical building set within extensive grounds featuring two large lawns set on different levels. In order to include views of the house wherever possible we decided to site the dining area on the lower lawn with the night club / dance area on the upper level. The only drawback for us was the slightly tricky access which meant much of our equipment by hand.



Marquee Design Summary:

By siting the marquee at a slight distance from the house and providing 3m high glass windows everyone was able to appreciate the views on offer, and this extends to the outdoor area where a glass balustrade around a wooden decked area provided safety for the guests, and the three Chinese hat style roof only coverings gave protection from the elements. The square dining room was finished with contemporary white flat linings and silver grey carpet. White chairs with white seat pads, pin spot and a fairy light canopy behind the linings contributing to the modern look, with pink-filtered up-lights around the edge of the marquee offering a subtle touch of colour. The night club area featured stunning star cloth and black-out lining complemented by a star lit white dance floor and black carpet for the remaining flooring. The round bar unit with integrated lighting made a stunning centrepiece for serving evening cocktails. Linking the two areas was a short wide staircase, which made for another memorable moment when the happy couple took to the dance floor for the first dance. At a total cost of £50,000.00 incl VAT this also included a generator with a backup generator and staff on site during the event to make sure everything ran smoothly.
