She is taking the rule of big sister very seriously.

Gina and I are feeling a little older having five children. The first two weeks have been great; however, we have had many appointments for the kids we must attend. The appointment schedule should slow down some in the coming weeks as the new "normal" sets in. We celebrated 19 years of marriage this month. Our God is faithful!

Spiritual attacks are real. We realize this as we continue to lean forward in faith. These attacks come in many different forms. We know we are being prayed for by many. We ask that you do not stop! In December as we were traveling home for

Texas, we were caught in the tornados in Arkansas. The funnel clouds were literally all around us. As you can see on the radar photo, the storm sent around the little blue dot (US!). On January 16, when we were returning home from a memorial service, we discovered the café towels smoldering in the laundry room. As soon as the bask was taken outside, it went up in flames. Our family is doing well. As many of you are aware, we are now a family of seven and not five. We began praying about adoption as a family in September. There was a situation shaping up for a private adoption. This began us journeying through the foster to adopt classes and certification. By Tuesday, the official call came, no weekend visit on Friday, but a permanent placement on Thursday! So, on Thursday, February 25, we added a seven-year-old active boy, and a smart six-year-old girl to our family.

The process was just the beginning of the rollercoaster ride! Adding two children we still know very little about has been challenging. However, overall, this journey has been a huge blessing for all involved. We already introduce both as our son and daughter; they both call us "Dad" and "Mom". The transition has been and will continued to be bathed in much prayer. Because of the process and privacy, we are not allowed to post pictures of the kids yet. Trust, we are taking a ton, just not posting.


