

The Feast Day of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Sunday 9 June 2024 (Year B)

"...planted in love and built on love"

Along the path of life, at different times we come across selfish and unselfish people. Perhaps we are all a mixture of generosity and selfishness. But to the extent that we may still be partly selfish, self-centred and suspicious, we've missed the point of Jesus' invitation to discipleship. — which we heard in a Gospel recently. "This is my Commandment that you love one for another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (*Jn 15*).

Our devotion to the Sacred Heart, which is honoring and receiving God's love made tangible in the life of Jesus is meant to be human, humane and practical, open to recognising and sharing that love in others.

This weekend, we gather to celebrate as a school and a parish the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and to appreciate what a gift it is to be part of this Sacred Heart Community that has been sustained over a hundred years by generous hearts who nurtured and shared its spirit through times of war, dire poverty, sectarianism, unemployment, faith and family challenges.

The readings today remind us of the nature of God's love for humanity as expressed through the life, sufferings and death of Jesus.

In the First Reading from Hosea, God speaks as a loving parent of a dear child: a child he "called out of Egypt", reminding Israel of the great act of liberation when they were released from slavery and began their frightening journey to the Promised Land. "I led them with reins of kindness, with leading-strings of love". God is like a loving parent who lifts the child tenderly to his cheek. Another beautiful image of our loving God and easy to understand if we think of a mother, who, in wonder and absolute joy holds her newborn infant close to her after long and anxious time of labour. "Can a mother forget her child...." Isaiah)

The Second Reading from Paul to the Ephesians is a beautiful prayer. He prays that those he is addressing may deepen their understanding of God's plan of salvation in Christ. He prays that Christ may live in their hearts – the same Love that emanates from the Heart of Christ – through faith. Then, "planted in love and built on love" they will be able, with Christians everywhere, to grasp the immensity of God's love which penetrates to every corner of our universe. Finally, having come to an intimate and experience of the love of Christ, they may be "filled with the utter fullness of God".

So today we as we celebrate the extraordinary love of God that has shaped us as a community, built and enriched by many cultures of the peoples of our church, let us give thanks for the gifts given and the blessings received by us through all who have gone before us - including our Priests and Religious Teachers, Members of St Vincent de Paul, Volunteers, Caretakers, Parents and their Families, Donors, - the Sisters of the Good Samaritan with us from the start, who in those foundation years in Preston- a poor area at the time - not only helped ground the establishment of religious education for our northern

areas but who provided not only education but also, food for little ones and families struggling with minimal support. But let us not stop there. If we are fully to receive that Love and if it is to be truly effective in our lives, then it must be passed on to every person we meet. "By this will all know that you are my followers."(Jn) And this Love is to have no limits. It's about Compassion, Humility, Enabling, Supporting, Forgiveness, Respecting, Reconciliation.



It was Preparation Day, and to prevent the bodies remaining on the cross during the sabbath - since that sabbath was a day of special solemnity - the Jews asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken away. Consequently the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first man who had been crucified with him and then of the other. When they came to Jesus, they found he was already dead, and so instead of breaking his legs one of the soldiers pierced his side with a lance; and immediately there came out blood and water.
