### A GOLD STAR FROM MR. "G"

Harold Glasco and his bride of 62 years still attend all of Templeton's home football games. Every year, their daughter gifts the couple with season tickets and seating in Volunteer Stadium at the top of the bleachers, just below the announcer's booth.

Last Friday night, they arrived on campus and parked in what Glasco jokingly labeled "the old folks parking area" next to the tennis courts. They leisurely walked the distance into the stadium to their seats, and as they began to settle in, Glasco realized that he had lost his wallet.

“I back-tracked to see where I might have dropped it,” said Glasco who noted that it was dark by then, further complicating matters. “As I was heading back the way we came in, I passed by some boys sitting on a bench.”

“Boys, have you seen grandpa’s wallet?” he asked. The boys hadn’t, but as he continued on in his search, two of them got up to help him look. And they continued helping him search all the way back to where his car was parked. No luck.

But there was one last possibility. He was driving his wife’s car that night instead of his pickup. Could his wallet have fallen out of his pocket in the car? Hoping against hope, Glasco unlocked the car, searched, and much to his relief, found his wallet.

“Boys I can’t thank you enough for your help,” he told the two teenagers as they left to meet up with their friends. As Glasco headed to the stadium, he saw them one more time and thanked them again.

“Those boys were just marvelous!” said Glasco. “I don’t know their names, but they deserve a gold star!”

**Editor’s Note!** Mr. “G” as THS athletes call Glasco, served on Templeton’s school board from 1980-84 and coached pitching with former, long-time THS Coaches Jerry and Val Reynolds. He remembers coaching many of Templeton’s pitchers – including Jim Campana, the father of THS Athletic Director Lindsay Campana Franklin. He noted that he taught Jim, and then Jim taught his daughter Lindsay, who then went on to pitch for North Carolina State after four CIF Championships at THS. Franklin has continued the tradition and is also passing her skills on to the next generation. Glasco pitched for the Air Force Fast Pitch Team during his time in the military. In addition to football, the Glasco’s also regularly attend basketball and softball games at the high school throughout the year.


