Howard Thurman (born Nov. 18, 1899, Daytona Beach, Fla.,—died April 10, 1981, San Francisco, Calif.)was an American Baptist preacher and theologian, the first African American dean of chapel at a traditionally white American university, and a founder of the first interracial interfaith congregation in the United States.

Thurman was the grandson of former slaves who stressed education as a means of overcoming racial discrimination. He graduated as valedictorian from Morehouse College, a predominantly black school, with a BA in economics in 1923, and from Rochester Theological Seminary with a Bachelor of Divinity in 1926. He subsequently served as pastor of a Baptist church in Oberlin, Ohio, and pursued graduate course work in theology at Oberlin College.

In January 1929 Thurman resigned his pastorate in order to pursue a semester of directed graduate study at Haverford College. Thurman absorbed a deep sense of the need to cultivate one's interior life. That fall Thurman returned to Morehouse as a professor. In 1932 he became dean of Rankin Chapel at the prestigious and primarily black Howard University. A meeting in 1934 with Mohandas K. Gandhi instilled within Thurman an appreciation for the value of nonviolent resistance in combating racial inequality. He subsequently wed nonviolence and the appreciation he had gained from previous teachers for the inward personal relationship with God with a deeply religious sense of protest against institutionalized race-based segregation.

In 1953, he assumed the deanship of Boston University's Marsh Chapel. In his sermons and in his classes, he inspired Martin Luther King, Jr., and other students committed to social justice who would participate in the civil rights movement.

From Rev. Amy:

I was reminded by a Seminary friend to look again at the New Year prayer (above) written by the Rev. Dr. Howard Thurman. As you will note in the information about Dr. Thurman, he was dean at Marsh Chapel at Boston University and taught at the BU School of Theology. Although my graduating class was years later, we all knew well the works and writing of Dr. Thurman. His death came just before I started Seminary in January 1982. An incredible man of immeasurable spirit, compassion, integrity and conviction, he spoke with a deeply resonate voice that could move a mountain. As I write this, I can clearly hear the recording of him reading Psalm 139.

Powerful doesn't cover it.

As I look back at his impact, I can't help but believe that these words, witness and prayers are powerful and necessary impetus for today. My heart is crushed at the level of brokenness in our country and world. The intense viciousness and callous disregard for others are so antithetical to the ways of Jesus. We can and must step forward and lead others by our example. In all we do and say we must exemplify the way of Jesus: non-violence, radical hospitality, love of neighbor and enemy alike. We can and will continue to feed, house, heal, love those with whom we come into contact.

Matthew 25: For I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink.


