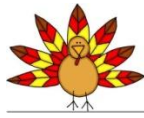

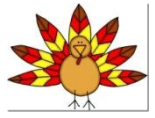

**The Sky is Fallen!**



On September 30th, it appeared to be a normal day – warm with routine warnings of a possible storm. Late that afternoon all heck broke out. Long story-short, there was roof-rattling wind, a tornado north of us (in Belen), traffic-stopping torrential rain and hail as big as baseballs that caused havoc throughout northern Socorro County.



When everything stopped long enough to look up, there were shattered skylights and windows, ripped out roofs, impassable roads, a closed-down interstate highway (I-25), homes with extensive water damage (a few houses were completely washed out), flooded fields – and warnings that another storm was headed our way.

Once Interstate I-25 was reopened, it was shocking. The center median was completely flooded and the beautiful pecan orchard had huge sections washed out with

many trees laying near the highway with roots sticking up in the air.

At this point the miracles and community angels came out. Our own Commissioner Martha Salas spearheaded efforts to help and coordinated volunteers. Minnie Presley, a widow in Veguita, had her skylights knocked out, her entire property flooded, a damaged roof, and extensive water damage in her home.



Commissioner Salas not only provided moral and spiritual support and inspiration to Minnie,



but also made sure volunteers came out to help her seal the roof and gaping holes from shattered skylights.

Community angels helped many others dig out vehicles from mudslides, helped seal roofs, clean up flood damage, and more.



It's now been a month since the big storm hit, and there are still some remnants visible. Regardless of the nightmare of that storm, what truly stands out is the fact that we have some incredible people in our community and heaven-sent leadership!

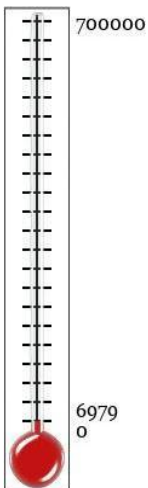

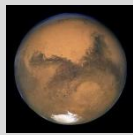

## Promotional \$\$ Available

*Application deadline is Nov. 15*

Are you part of the New Mexico agriculture industry? Do you have a development, marketing or promotional idea for your product or business? Or do you belong to a group that has an innovative idea? The New Mexico Department of Agriculture is accepting applications for its Agricultural Development and Promotion Funds Program. Grant amounts

range from approximately \$500 to \$10,000 for individual applicants and up to \$30,000 for joint initiatives. The application deadline is Nov. 15.

The ADPPF was designed to promote agricultural growth and rural stability, maintain or increase market share for products already on the market, develop markets for new products and develop value-added products.

“Agriculture in New Mexico is diverse, and our products have become popular across the world,” said New Mexico Secretary of Agriculture Jeff Witte. “These limited funds allow our producers and processors an opportunity to develop and expand markets and help produce jobs and economic growth, especially in rural areas of New Mexico.”

Not only may funds be applied to specialty crops, such as fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, horticulture and nursery crops, but funds may also be used for projects that support the marketing efforts of the livestock industry including beef, sheep and wool, poultry and other livestock. Funds may not be used for start-up costs or common costs of doing business, and projects must be completed before June 30, 2018. Payment is on a reimbursement basis.

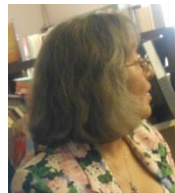
**Liquid Salt.** An average cup of Campbell's regular Condensed Soup has 800 mg of sodium, but if you eat the whole can, which contains about 2,000 mg of sodium, you have eaten more sodium than you should for an entire day! Look for Campbell's Healthy Request soups with 410 mg of sodium per cup (still too much if you eat the whole can. Better yet, choose lower sodium soups by Amy's, Dr. McDougall's Imagine, Pacific and Trader Joe's.

**Tortilla Terror.** Have you tried a Chipotle Chicken Burrito with tortilla, rice, pinto beans, cheese, chicken, sour cream and salsa? Its 1,050 calories, 17 gms of saturated fat and 2,400 mg of sodium are equal to six Taco Bell Chicken Soft Tacos!



**Triple Bypass.** You can forget ordering just one or two entrees. You get three entrees at Olive Garden Restaurant if you order their Tour of Italy, which is lasagna, chicken parmigiana and fettuccine alfredo. Be aware, however, that this order comes with 1,520 calories, 48 gms of saturated fat and 3,250 mg of sodium. Add a breadstick (140 calories and 460 mg of sodium for each stick) and a serving of house salad with dressing (140 calories and 740 mg of sodium) and you'll swallow 1,800 calories and 4,450

**Pot Belly Pie.** Stouffer's Satisfying Servings (16 oz.) White Meat Chicken

mg of sodium (3 days' worth) in one sitting.

**Starbucks on Steroids.** Their Venti (20 oz.) White Chocolate Mocha with 2% milk and whipped cream is more than a mere cup of coffee. It has as many calories as a McDonald's Quarter Pounder with Cheese. This tasty drink has 530 calories, 14 gms of saturated fat and about 10 teaspoons of sugar!



**Extreme Ice Cream.** Ben & Jerry's and Haagen-Dazs ice

creams squeeze about 300 calories with about 4 ½ teaspoons of added sugar into your fat calls (and half a day's saturated fat into your artery walls). And these figures are only if you can stop at a petite half-cup!

In summary, I think that our community's habit of eating home-cooked meals at home rather than eating out all the time is looking better and better every day!

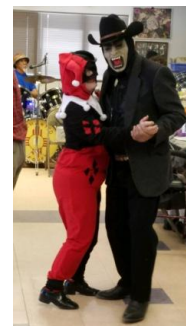
