CALIFORNIA: CAUTIONS AND COUNCIL CAUTIONS

CEQA: The 2015 changes state that any lane and parking construction have no impact on transportation. (AB 1866 (Fong) includes a repeal of policies that encourage Road Diets.)

Bills by Senate Leader, Kevin De Leon:

SB 551: Establishes the California Excellence Fund.

SB 227: Allows a credit to reduce the regular tax below the tentative minimum tax. This would not pass unless SB 551 passes first.

COUNCIL CAUTIONS:

Bills by Assemblyman Brough:

AB 1756: A repeal of the Gas Tax. Beware when you sign petitions as they present a packet of Democratic bills to sign underneath the Gas Tax and Prop 13 Bills.

AB 1900: California Economic Incentive Package: In the last 7 years, 9.000 California companies moved or diverted to out of state locations. This bill would bring back business including property tax incentives, along with regulatory and environmental changes.

Bills from Senator Pat Bates:

PROP 57: The Senator is working hard to reverse PROP 57 and the early release of all sex offenders.

SB 1109: This would require better training for physicians and more patient information for opiate treatments.

Sober Living Homes Legislation: Keep posted.

A PRAYER FOR SPRING IN AMERICA


Dear Lord,
