Biography

Emil John Heck, 96, of Cass City, formerly of Harrison, passed away Saturday, May 14, 2022 at Northwood Meadows in Cass City. Emil was born March 4, 1926 in Owendale to the late John and Irene (Errer) Heck. He served in the US Army during World War II, serving in the Pacific Theater between 1944 and 1946. He worked as a farmer and journeyman tool and die. He married Fern Heck and raised his family near Elkton. After Fern died in 1983 he married Catherine Melnik and moved near Ubly. Later he moved to his cabin in the woods in Harrison.
