CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

OF

FORT LANGLEY COMMUNITY ROWING CLUB

As approved November 21, 2010

CONSTITUTION

- 1. The name of the Society shall be the Fort Langley Community Rowing Club
- 2. The purposes of the Society are
 - (a) to promote inclusive and accessible competitive and recreational rowing and sculling as a means of improving health and well-being of the members of the Society, with a focus on safety and in a spirit of communication and cooperation with our partners in the rowing community and our local community;
 - (b) to hold regattas, sports events and amusements in general to promote and encourage the physical and social well-being of the members of the Society and it's purpose as outlined in 2(a), and advance the sport of rowing;
 - (c) to acquire and take by purchase, donation, devise or otherwise, and to hold for the use of the members of the Society any and all kinds of real and personal property in the Province of British Columbia;
 - (d) to construct, rent, lease, provide, occupy, maintain and regulate any suitable buildings, premises, conveniences, or place or places of resort for the members of the Society;
 - (e) to sell, exchange, mortgage, lease, let or otherwise dispose of all or any part of the real or personal property of the Society;
 - (f) to affiliate and cooperate with other societies or clubs formed for the purposes set out in paragraph 2(a) above or any similar purposes;
 - (g) to do all such other acts as are incidental or conducive to the fulfillment of the above purposes or any of them.
- 3. In the event that the Society should, at any time, be wound up or dissolved, the remaining assets, after payment of all debts and liabilities, shall be turned over to another registered society with purposes similar to those of the Society or if this cannot be done, to another society in the Province or elsewhere in Canada as directed by the members.

- 4. The Society shall carry out its purposes without purpose of financial gain for its members, and shall use any profits or other accretions to the Society for promoting its purposes, and shall carry out its purposes on an exclusively charitable basis.
- 5. The Society shall not remunerate any director or officer for being or acting as a director or officer, but may reimburse a director or officer for all expenses necessarily and reasonably incurred while engaged in the affairs of the Society.
- 6. Articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 are unalterable.
