As the shepherds saw the Christ Child, they went and told everyone of the Good News. I still feel that call to go everywhere to give the Good News!

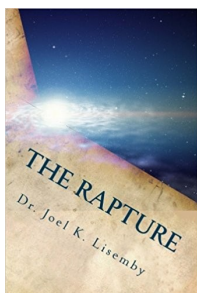
