Our November speaker, **Kathy Groves, will be giving a lecture on "How to Eat an Elephant."** In this case she will be talking about how any guilter can tackle the beautiful challenge of a Judy Niemeyer guilt.

In January the guild is hosting <u>two</u> <u>workshops</u> with Kathy on Zoom and both have an easier pattern and a harder pattern. You can choose one pattern and we'll bulk order the patterns from Kathy.

Workshop 1 (Saturday Afternoons, 1:30pm CST, 1/9/2021 + 1/16/2021):

- Poinsettia (easier)
- Tea Time (harder)

Workshop 2 (Tuesday Afternoons, 1:30pm CST, 1/19/2021 + 2/2/2021):

- -Paintbox (easier)
- Fractured Star (harder)

Kathy will also have a limited amount of kits available.

We'll also be setting up some optional extra Zoom meetings for workshop participants to make sure you have your supplies and are ready to sew. Remember that the workshops will be recorded, so if you have a schedule conflict for one or both workshops, but still want to attend, you can watch the video to catch up with the rest of us.

Some members of the guild have already signed up to attend one of the workshops from the previous survey we sent out. For those that gave their contact information we will be contacting them in the next week.

If you haven't signed up yet, watch your email closely for a new Sign-Up Survey. It will be sent once the final details are confirmed with Kathy on kit pricing. Since the guild is hosting these workshops we've brought the price down from the standard cost on Kathy's website for individuals. This will be a great opportunity for you to improve your skills and share in some community with your fellow guild members.

We are half-full for both workshops, so don't delay in signing up because it's first come, first served, and there are only twenty spots for each workshop. If a workshop fills let me know if you want to be on reserve list in case someone drops out, or if you'd like to pay an extra amount to join in with this workshop.

Lighthouse Quilters Guild Guild Meeting October 26, 2020 Zoom Virtual Meeting

30 Guild members attended Melissa Wraalstad's presentation "Wisconsin Quilts: History in Stitches". Melissa is the Executive Director of the Wisconsin Museum of Quilts and Fiber Arts (WMQFA). USA Today has described the museum as one of the ten best places to see a quilt. Melissa described the purpose of the Museum and discussed samples from its collection.

The Museum documents, stores and displays quilts, laces, coverlets and other textiles. Melissa emphasized the importance of documenting your quilts and recommended exploring quiltindex.org, a website for quilt documentation around the country. She also told the Guild that the best way to preserve quilts is to keep them out of direct sunlight. Melissa explained the history or several quilts from the collection.

WMQFA's current exhibit, Quarantine Quilts, will be on display until November 15. The Museum offers several programs and is planning a virtual bus tour to Chicago on December 3rd. Log onto their website (wiquiltmuseum.com) for further information.

The November virtual program for the Guild Is "How to Eat an Elephant" by Kathy Groves. Kathy will discuss Judy Niemeyer quilts. Laura Sanders will be planning new virtual programs for 2021.

After the presentation, there was a lively discussion of plans for the Guild's 2021 Quilt Show. Mary Wolter emphasized that more Guild members are needed to help plan the show. We recognize that Covid might interfere with planning, and the Guild may need to consider alternative methods of putting on a Show or may need to defer it.

The Guild Show Committee will be discussing these issues further.

The estimated size of the quilting market is \$4.2 billion, up slightly from \$4.1 billion in 2018 and \$3.8 billion in 2014. North America has between 9-11 million quilters, a number that's been stable (between 8-12 million) over the last decade. 98% of quilting consumers are female and 65% are retired.
