This letter report is provided in accordance with the City of Gervais’ recently updated TMDL Implementation Plan to report on the City’s TMDL related activities for 2016. Management strategies and the related activities are identified below:

Management Strategies for Reduction of All Pollutants of Concern

Actively maintain Sam Brown Creek	Maintenance activities were performed as documented in the Maintenance Log. No new trees planted in 2016. See attached Photos.
Require erosion control for City construction projects	Two small drainage project were constructed by the City in 2016. See attached Log of City Erosion Control Measures.
Receive and respond to complaints regarding water quality problems (erosion; illicit discharge)	No complaints received in 2016.
Hold annual public cleanup day; continue ongoing cleanup by Public Works	Public cleanup day was held on April 23, 2016 as posted on the City's website. Cleanup Day Flyer is attached.

Regular sweeping of city streets	The normal street sweeping was performed in 2016. See attached Street Sweeping Log.

Management Strategies for Reduction of Temperature

Enhance riparian vegetation along Sam Brown Creek	No new vegetation was planted along Sam Brown Creek in 2016 as discussed below. See attached Photo Documentation of Sam Brown Creek.
Maintain status as City Tree USA	Due to vandalism of new trees, the City did not plant any trees in 2016 and is evaluating its approach to tree planting. It is likely tree planting will resume in 2017 with larger trees being planted.

Enforce ban on pets in City parks (Ord. 13.001)	This continues to be the City's policy, with signage at all parks indicating this rule. Photos of signage attached.
