Tidings from Timothy

This morning's lesson

has to do with Christian warfare. I have long felt that people's misunderstanding of what the Christian is called to fight with and to work with is one of the world's greatest misunderstandings. If they could see what the church really is after as directed by Christ, maybe they would not think so poorly of us or hold things against us. Our study of the Christian fight will be based on Ephesians 6:10ff.

The Sunday night lesson will be less technical than before as I revisit a story that I recently studied with my Middle/High School class – Jael in Judges 4.

The Hatton Half: Misconceptions about Biblical Inspiration

There are some misconceptions with regard to what inspiration is. Some scholars hold to the contention that inspiration is simply a process of mechanical dictation. If it were the case that mechanical dictation was the mode of inspiration, how may one account for all the stylistic inconsistencies between the authors? If mechanical dictation was the truth on the matter, the Bible's reading would be boring and monotonous, for no variation would exist. If variation within the styles of the writers exists, then mechanical dictation cannot be the answer as to what inspiration truly is. Turner stated "inspiration was not a mechanical process. It did not do for a person that which the person could do for himself. When Balaam's donkey spoke, the Holy Spirit had impinged upon that donkey; a mere and rare instance of mechanical inspiration" (35)!

Not only do some believe inspiration is a mechanical dictation, but some also believe that inspiration freed someone from sinning. If this was the case, man's free will was infringed at the time of the Bible's transmission. At Galatians 2:11-14, Paul is said to have "withstood him (Peter, HA) to the face, because he was to be blamed" (Gal. 2:11). Peter is an inspired man, for he preached the first gospel sermon on pentecost day (Acts 2). Peter contended with personal concerns of being seen with the Gentiles. Initially Peter did not believe Gentiles were worthy candidates for entrance into God's kingdom. It was proved to him both by a vision (Acts 10:11-17) and by miraculous activity occurring before him, which was the ability to speak in tongues (Acts 10:45-47). The gift of tongues was given as a sign to the unbeliever (1 Cor. 14:22). This was infallible proof of the Gentile's belonging in the church. This is the root of the problem with which Paul contended in Galatia.

hey are excited. A new home. Their loan has gone through. They answered the million and one questions satisfactorily and without balking once. The bank knows their complete financial history. Financing is 8.5 percent. The papers are shoved in front of them. Eagerly, with a nervous smile at one another, they sign. The house will be theirs after 360 payments of only \$800.00 each month.

With a new house, comes new furniture, new curtains, and a thousand other things. More papers are shoved under their noses. Questions are asked and answered without the blink of an eye. Signatures are expertly written without hesitation. Payments for all these new things will run \$432.18 a month for the next 36 months.

The old clunker detracts from the new house. One cannot maintain the proper image if one has a new house and an automobile that is three years old. Hi-ho, hi-ho, to the car dealership we go. A deal is struck, financial history is completed, papers are signed. They will pay only \$275.85 a month for the next 60 months.

Christmas is coming up. No problem. Both she and he have Visa and Master Cards. Their limits on both are \$2,500.00. If they go the limit, the monthly payments will only be 10% of the amount. Isn't plastic wonderful?

During none of these financial transactions did this couple say, "We can't sign this contract for this much money. Why? What if we lost our jobs next month?" Not once did they say, "I never know from one week to the next what I will be making, so I can't tell you whether I will be able to make the same payment each month or not." Not once did they say, "It is none of your business what kind of payment we will make each month on this house you are selling us." Not once did they say, "I'll send you what I can, if I happen to be in the neighborhood."

Not once did he or she say one to another, "We need this or that, so let's cut our house payment in half for the next two months and our car payment in half next month."

No, they waited until they arrived at church before they used these reasons for not purposing to the Lord's work (II Corinthians 9:7).
