

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

#### LOVING AS GOD LOVES

John's Gospel does not include what we know as the Lord's Prayer;



however, an entire chapter is devoted to his Father at the Last Supper. This prayer, if you will, is John's "Lord's Prayer." Jesus is praying to His Father, but He is praying for His disciples, both the apostles who are there with Him and also all "who will believe in Me through their word," which means that even we are included (John 17:20). In the section of the prayer we hear today, Jesus specifically prays that all his disciples may be one. Since the Church is

the body of Christ, Jesus is asking that His body may remain unified, just as He and His Father are united.

How do you picture God? In his Gospel, John wrote, "No one has ever seen God" (John 1:18). He repeated this statement in his letter, but he gave us a way to see God: "No one has ever seen God."

Yet, if we love one another, God remains in us, and His love is brought to perfection in us" (1 John 4:12). The love that John described in his letter that we have heard over the last several Sundays – love that is generous and self-

less, love that is faithful and merciful, love that is active and truthful, love, in short, that imitates the love God has for us — will lead us to seeing God. When we love one another in this way, we can see God. For many of us, appropriately on this Mother's Day, our first example of this kind of self-sacrificing love was from our mothers.

This, then, links the two greatest commandments. In loving our neighbor, whom we see, we love God, who we cannot. In this way, truly God's love is brought to perfection.

The Holy Spirit is ever ready to help us with His grace of Fortitude so as to bear our cross with courage, overcome our cross and reach our final destination – HEAVEN!

Where our Risen Savior has gone, may we follow (when our time comes) AMEN.


