THE CHRISTIAN SCIENCE MONITOR ARTICLE ON THE SINIXT PEOPLE

The November 11, 2024 issue of The Christian Science Monitor welcomes its readers to the world of an Indigenous people delared "extinct" in 1956 by the Canadian Government. My husband is an enrolled member of the Spokane Tribe of Indians which includes many Sinixt. Both sides of his family are Sinixt (Arrow Lakes) descendants pushed off their traditional territory by miners, settlers, government edicts, and greed, confined on reservations in Washington State. The international boundary has separated different tribes from their ancestral lands all along the arbitary, continent-wide border placed between the United States and Canada.

How satisfying it has been to read this accurate and clear account of the Sinixt struggles to achieve recognition of their continued presence, and to be legally and culturally affirmed by the Supreme Court of Canada! Staff writer, Sara Miller Llana and staff photographer Melanie Stetson Freeman have captured the essence of these years-long efforts and the actual court cases experienced by the Sinixt who say: "WE HAVE ALWAYS BEEN HERE. WE ARE STILL HERE."

The Sinixt know: "The salmon, the water, and all our prayers have no borders." Their concept of Creator is expressed in their word k^w l'ancútan. Its English translation: one who made oneself.

The people in the photos are my husbands relatives.

I have been told by the publisher that a lot of interest in the Monitor and in this article has been expressed by other tribes. ~ Tina Wynecoop
