וַיֹאמֶר יָהוָה אַל-אַבְרָם, לַדְּ-לָדְּ מָאַרְצַדְּ וּמָמּוֹלַדְתִּדְּ וּטבית אביד, אל-הארץ, אשר אראד.

The Lord said to Abram,

'Go forth from your native land and from your father's house to the land that I will show you.

(New JPS Translation, 1985).

And here we are, Elchanan and Yocheved and family, moving to a place we know God has shown us. For months we prayed for Hashem to give us a platform, somewhere we can bring Jewish people together, inspire them and build a better future for klal yisrael. For more reasons than I can list here we know God has given us CSI; we stand ready to serve the shul, and together with the congregation to build that better future.

Commenting on God's command to Avraham and Sarah the 11th century giant, Rashi, notes the repetition (apparent in the Hebrew text) of the verb commanding them to go, "lech lecha". Basing himself on the Talmud and Midrash he explains that God is gently reassuring them that although moving usually entails drawbacks – specifically, relocation dampens building a family, accumulating wealth, and requires building a reputation anew - God guarantees that this move will bring them family, comfort and a burnished reputation.

od's first recorded command to a Jew was move And here we are, Yocheved and I, moving and yet already confident that this move will bring only

> Blessings. With our oldest children living in the area our family will be strengthened (and perhaps now grow a new generation). As for comfort, included in the generous compensation approved by the congregation comes a beautiful parsonage; our thanks to Red Avner and his committee for readying the house for our arrival, and we look forward to sharing our home with

all of you! And as for reputation, we are so honored to serve the merger of two august congregations and to follow in the footsteps of many revered clergy – most especially our Rabbi and Rebbetzin Emeritus, Rabbi and Mrs. Chanofsky.

Several verses after the command we are told that Avraham traveled to Beit El and set up his tent, ohaloh. The Midrash as quoted by Rashi notes that the while the pronunciation follows the masculine form, ohaloh, the written text spells ohalah, the feminie form meaning her tent, teaching that first he set up Sarah's tent and then set up his own. There is so much for me to do setting up my Shaarey Israel tent – people to meet, services, sermons and classes to prepare, and working with the Board and its committees to further strengthen our shul. At the same time I must devote some energies to setting up a home for Yocheved and our family; please bear with us through this exciting transition. Together, united and with the help of Hashem, Congregation Shaarey Israel will go forth to ever greater blessings!

This song was part of a play written for, and performed on, Purim. The audience clapped and laughed, and all of us, cast included, had a really fantastic time. And then, for me, it was over and life went on. That was 2013 and our second production. 2014 saw another play with greater audiences, more laughter and applause.

In 2015, we didn't have a performance. We couldn't get a script together, so there was no play. No biggie, I thought. After all, it was just a play. True, it was a fundraiser, but it was an evening of ephemeral joy. I would miss it but it really did not seem like skipping it was such a big deal.

Well, it turns out that it was. This year we returned from our one year hiatus and performed again on Purim with a new script, new songs and great laughter. A few days later, I was buying some wine in a local store and a woman approached me. She told me how much she enjoyed the performance and

how grateful she was that we did these

productions. It seems that she saw our 2014 performance shortly after she completed her year of mourning for her father. She told me that the laughs were the first real laughs she had in over a year. In that moment, I realized how important those performances were beyond the fundraising and fun aspects. They really made a difference in someone's life.

Being able to make someone laugh is an incredible thing. Laughter releases endorphins, burns calories, increases heart rate and, just plain feels great. People who laugh more in their lives tend to have a more positive outlook, can deal with stress better and can live longer and healthier lives. To quote the famous Yiddish author, Shalom Aleichem, "It's healthy to laugh." Perhaps the **Reader's Digest** says it even better with the title of one of their humor columns: "Laughter, the Best Medicine."

Our sages were aware of the power of laughter. The Talmud teaches us in the tractate Shabbat (page 30B): "Even as Rabbah before he commenced [his discourse] before the scholars used to say something humorous, and the scholars were cheered; after that he sat in awe and began the discourse." Indeed, when I used to give technical lectures, I always used to start with a humorous anecdote that would weave into my topic somehow. It made the 75-90 minute lectures go much smoother.

It might surprise you to hear this but there's Torah in them thar jokes too.

Recently, I went through a couple of rough days. I call days like that, "Reverse Midas Days." I am sure we are all aware of the legend of King Midas who supposedly could turn anything he touched to gold. Someone who has the "Midas Touch" is someone who is successful at anything he or she attempts. (continue on next page)

In effect, everything they touch also turns to gold. So, a Midas Day is a day when everything goes right. A Reverse Midas Day... well, you get the picture. I will admit to being frustrated and even a little depressed about it.

When I go through something like that, I tend to go silent. I don't want to discuss it and I don't want to have someone help me make sense of it all. I just want to find a hole somewhere, pull the sod over me and wait until the sun shines again.

Well, this time I was kind of moping a little and a friend at work came over to me and just cracked a joke. I can tell he knew that I had something on my mind. All he did was come over to me and hit me with a quick joke from out of left field. He caught me totally off guard and I just burst out laughing. Not just a giggle, I exploded in convulsions of laughter that must have lasted about 30 seconds. He just stood there, silently, with a small grin on his face. When I finally caught my breath, I looked at him and said, "Thanks, I needed that." He responded with a nod and said, "I know" after which we went back to work. That one belly laugh is all it took to lift my mood and restore a measure of my positive attitude.

Shavuos is the time when Hashem gave us the Torah which is the source of all wisdom. I have heard some people come to me with the opinion that learning Torah is "not for them" as if Torah is only meant for serious students who sit on a bench all day with large tomes open before them. I assure you that is absolutely not the case. Torah is not only a source of knowledge and understanding but it also a source of joy and laughter.

It has been my experience that my learning sessions usually leave me in a better mood than when I started. Whether I am learning in a group or on my own, it always seems to afford me a positive boost to my outlook for the

remainder of the day. I can't say that I can explain the phenomenon, but I have found it normally to be true.

As the song at the beginning of this article states, there is a tradition to learn Torah on the first night of Shavuos. Rabbi Weinbach will be leading our Shavuos night learning classes and they promise to be fascinating. I too will be giving a lecture (on customs of Yahrzeit). The evening has always been a time of community, celebration of the Yom Tov and sharing words of Torah. In the years since I have joined Shaarey Israel, I have always walked away from the learning sessions better than when I walked in. I bet you'll find that too.

Come and join us.

Chana, Yitzchak and I would like to extend a hearty welcome to Rabbi Elchanan and Yocheved Weinbach to our Shaarey Israel family. I look forward to working with him and we all hope that his tenure with us will be long, successful and happy!



THE ALEPH BETS OF HEBREW

ebrew is not such a difficult egg to crack. Each month, I plan to try and define Hebrew words and expressions that we commonly use in our daily vernacular.

In a few short weeks, we will be celebrating the festival of **Shavuot**. The holiday goes by a few different names. Among them is **Chag Matan Torah**, which means the holiday of the giving of the **Torah** by HaShem to the Hebrews (our Jewish People).

It is very interesting that the word **Torah** is known by all; Jews and non-Jews alike. Many refer to the Jewish people as "People of the **Book**". Hmmm.....where does this come from? This is because when we reference the **Torah**, we mean **Torah Scroll** and when translated to Hebrew means **Torah "Book"**. The **Torah** should really be called **Sefer Torah** (**Torah Scroll**). When speaking of multiple scrolls, the plural becomes **Sifrei Torah**. This is because we, Jews, have only **ONE TORAH**, however, we can have multiple scrolls. Therefore, when referring to more than one, we should use **Torah Scrolls**. To

add an (s) to the word **Torah**, grammatically, is incorrect.

That being said, why is do we call the **Five Books of Moses (Chumash)** by the name **Torah?** Here we see the reference to the word **Sefer/Sefarim**.

The word comes from the infinitive **lihorot**, and means to direct, to show, and to teach. The root of the word is **yud-reish-hay**. This is because the **Torah** directs us, teaches us, and shows us the way to lead our lives now and in the future.

In Hebrew, the roots of commonly used words share the same root as the word **Torah**. The word **moreh/morah** which means teacher is derived from the same root as **Torah**. The root for parent(s) is **horeh/horim** also comes from.

The commonality of all of these is that the *Torah, parents, and teachers* all direct us, teach us, and show us to discern the difference between right and wrong.



Thoughts from Cantor Bazian

Note: The comments below were delivered as the Cantor's Report at the Congregational Board Meeting on May 19th, 2016. He was asked to submit this to **The Scroll** to share with the Congregation. The comments have been slightly edited for grammar and presentation.

Good evening.

This month marks the end of my tenure in what I have come to think of as "the interregnum" or "the time in between"; a 10 month period that started with the New Year at Rosh Hashana and is now closing with the entry of Rabbi Weinbach right before Shavuos. It has been an active and interesting 10 months.

I would like to begin by thanking the administration, and you, this Board. The year began on a very difficult note. With little warning, we were thrust into a situation that could have wrought untold havoc on the Congregation. We came together, worked as a team, and made it through. I will not pretend that it has been a perfect 10 months but, as they say, the proof is in the pudding. The challenges have been met and we are still here to tell the story.

For me, personally, there were difficult periods. However, I cannot stress enough how thankful I am for the support I received from the Congregation as a whole and this Board in particular. The support has been moral, practical, and financial. I would like to also thank so many of you here, and from the Congregation in general, who expressed your appreciation and support. Finally, I thank you for choosing to recognize our efforts at this year's Journal dinner. I will admit that there were times when the stress of handling the load was trying, and the words and actions of support made a huge difference to Chana and **7he Scroll...18** me.

Now that, through the grace of Hashem and the efforts of this board, we have a new Rabbi, I look forward to moving forward. I know that we can strengthen as an organization. I have always believed that we have a tremendous amount to offer the Jewish communities of Rockland and Bergen counties - we can and should make every effort to reach out and attract potential members. I am sure that we can achieve this and grow.

In this, my final report, I would like to respectfully issue my own appeal. I believe that it is our job to lead this Congregation together. Leadership can and must go beyond these meetings or activities on the Bima.

First, I ask for a commitment to improve our attendance at the daily Minyanim. The difficulties we have in getting a Minyan together during the week, both in the mornings and evenings, are disheartening. People rely on our services to Daven and say Kaddish. We owe it to them to always have a Minyan. I know that mornings, especially, can be a challenge but we can do it. If we all commit to attend just one or two Minyanim a week, and coordinate our attendance, we can ensure that we have a Minyan for all 11 weekday services.

Second, I ask that we work together to maintain decorum in the Shul. Shul prayer is a communal experience. I personally felt an incredible bond between us all when we recently sang Hallel together during the Pesach holiday. When we pray together, we are at our best as a Congregation. So please, let's come together and pray together. Let's make sure we respect the services and, more importantly, each other.

Third, in any group or organization there is normally going to be some disagreement. That is natural and expected. This organization is certainly no different. However, I especially beseech all of us to maintain respect and *Achdut*

with each other. The beard I wear today is in consideration of the *sefira* period and is a sign of mourning in memory of 24,000 students of Rabbi Akiva who died because they did not properly respect each other. We observe this to remind us how important it is that disagreements in this room must remain where they belong: right here. I am sure that if we look around the room, we will see that each person here has the same goal; the success of this Congregation. I think this cannot be emphasized enough. That one ultimate objective is what unites everyone in this room and motivates us to be here. It must unify us now.

I think this is especially critical at this juncture. When Rabbi Weinbach begins his official tenure in just 12 short days, I think it important that we, both the Rabbi and the Congregation, have the best chance for success. Rabbi Weinbach and I have had many conversations, and I am very excited to be working with him. I believe we are developing an excellent relationship, and I have tremendously high hopes. But, in order to give us the best chance for success, the Congregation must work together.

So, I ask that we make the effort in the next two weeks to ensure that we have complete *Achdut* and harmony within the board and the Congregation. Let's give Rabbi Weinbach a clean slate to work with. If there are any existing disagreements in the Congregation, let's find a way to end them and move forward. I think that the question of who is right or who is wrong should take a back seat to the ultimate goal of moving forward to a bright and successful future for the Shaarey Israel.

Finally, let me state: These comments are mine and mine alone, and I bear sole responsibility for their contents. I have tried to bring my points out in what I hope is a positive and respectful manner. If anything I have said has come across as anything other than that, I apologize, for that is not my intent.

Once again, I thank you for working with me the last 10 months. I consider myself proud to be the Cantor of this Congregation, and I thank you for affording me the opportunity to be here.


Read a Good Book Lately?.. Some Suggestions

Largest Almost Extinct Gefilte Fish Caught in Wild

As we are at the end of the competitive gefilte fishing season, it should come as no surprise that Jacob Fishman caught a 40 pound gefilte in Lake Rokeach. After reeling in and weighing the giant gefilte, he quickly placed it in a tub full of jellied broth.

The record-breaking fish will feed more than 150 people and be topped with a carrot slice at Passover meals around Atlanta this Friday night.



The Gefilte population has dwindled to dangerous lows and it is by only a miracle that one this large has been caught and served with a side of horseradish.

Fishman said that he's simply taking some time to savor his achievement. When asked what he plans on doing next, Jacob responded, "Dayenu, isn't this enough?"
