





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## **AUSTRALIA**

# Market falls as clearance rate drops to 84%





The Australian market dropped back this week, continuing the up-and-down trend seen over recent weeks.

The Australian Wool Exchange (AWEX) Eastern Market Indicator (EMI) fell by 10 cents (0.6%) for the week to close on 1,534 cents per kilo clean on Thursday 11 May. In US dollar terms, the market dropped by 19 cents (1.7%) to close on 1,127 US cents.

The Australian dollar against the US dollar dropped slightly on last week, falling 0.4% to 73.7 US cents.

Sales were held at all three selling centres on Wednesday 10 May and Thursday 11 May. On Wednesday, the EMI was up 5 cents to 1,549 cents, but in US dollar terms declined by 5 cents to 1,141 US cents. On Thursday, the EMI fell back by 15 cents to 1,534 cents, and in US dollar terms decreased by 14 cents to 1,127 US cents.

There were unusually large differences in the movements among the regional indicators, with the Northern Indicator down 24 cents for the week, the Southern Indicator unchanged, and the Western Indicator falling 33 cents.

Among the Merino fleece wools, the biggest falls came from the medium and broader types. 16 microns rose by 0.4%; 17 microns fell 1.1%; 17.5-18.5 microns dropped by 1.7%; 19 microns declined by 1.4%; 21 microns fell by 2.4%; and 22 microns decreased by 1.7%.

The crossbred types performed better than the Merino wools, with some small gains.

The overall market continues to fluctuate, with weekly movements in the EMI since 23 March of: down 44 cents; down 43 cents; up 53 cents; down 11 cents; up 43 cents; and down 10 cents. However, analysts said that the trade remains positive, with the EMI comfortably above 1,500 cents at present.

This week's national offering was 38,028 bales, which brought a clearance rate of 84%. The week's national pass-in rate of 16% was largely the result of a particularly high pass-in rate in the West of 28.5%, compared with 9.9% in the North and 12.3% in the South. The pass-in rate for the West is normally higher than the other two regions, though not to that extent. The pass-in rate in the West was 21.5% on Wednesday, and 35.3% on Thursday.


Analysts said that the especially high pass-in rate in the West can be explained by the influence of the direction of the market, rather than its level, and the fact that the auctions in the West finish later than those in the North and South due to the time difference – meaning that this week it especially felt the impact of the downward movement in the market on Thursday. In addition, no Merino wools of 17.5 microns or finer are available in the West.


China was the dominant player in the auction room this week, with competition from India and Europe.

The offering for next week's sale (Week 46) is forecast to be 36,343 bales, with 37,680 bales in Week 47 and 34,096 bales in Week 48.

## **NEW ZEALAND**

## Weaker NZ dollar boosts prices





The slightly weaker New Zealand dollar compared to last week's sale helped lift local prices. Of the 6,049 bales on offer, 78% sold. The weighted currency indicator was down 1.35% week on week.


Compared to the last time comparable wools were sold, on 27 April, in the North Island, fine crossbred shears were firm. Good style coarse crossbred fleece was firm with some of the inferior types attracting less interest dropping 1-5%.

Coarse good colour shears 3-5 inch to 2-4 inch showed good support, increasing 2-5% with shorter wools remaining firm. Poorer colour 2-4 inch shears eased by 2-5%. Fine first lambs were 3-7% dearer with 31 micron and coarser lambs easing 1-3%.

# SOUTH AFRICA

## Market 1.8% higher



The wool market traded higher at this week's auction and the Cape Wools Merino Indicator increased by 293 points (1.8%) to close at a value of R162.37 (Clean). The Cape Wools All Wool Indicator gained 1.9%.

The majority of wool offered traded dearer as volumes decline with the season tapering off. Buyers commented that the demand for good quality long fleece wool was excellent. Modiano turned the tables on its rival Standard Wool by purchasing the most wool at auction.

This week saw the rand at R13.54 to the US dollar. The rand was 2.8% weaker against the US dollar compared with the average rate at the previous sale. The rand was 2.4% weaker against the euro, trading at R14.70.

The offering comprised 6,657 bales of which 97.6% was sold. Major traders were Modiano (2,172 bales), Standard Wool SA (1,824), Lempriere SA (1,253), and

Stucken & Co (799).

The average clean prices for the selection within the different micron categories for good top-making (MF5), long fleeces were as follows: 18 microns increased 0.9% to close at R221.30/kg; 18.5 microns increased 1.1% to close at R215.71/kg; 19 microns gained 1.3% to close at R196.14/kg; 19.5 microns moved up 1.6% to close at R172.44/kg; 20 microns increased 2.3% to close at R158.59/kg; 20.5 microns moved up 3.2% to close at R152.23/kg; 21 microns strengthened 3.4% to close at R147.76/kg; 21.5 microns increased 2% to close at R142.49/kg; 22 microns gained 2.3% to close at R134.15/kg; and 22.5 microns increased 3.1% to close at R137.92/kg.

## Mohair

# Indicator rises 2% despite stronger rand

The fifth sale of the 2017 summer season took place on 9 May, with 135,068 kg on offer. The offering consisted of some good quality mohair, with 99% of the mohair on offer being sold.

There was good competition from all the buying houses and despite the stronger rand against the US dollar, the market indicator closed 2% higher on R195.92 p/kg. The greasy buyers were particularly active, taking up 30% of the offering.

It must be noted that the larger than usual volume of strong adult hair offered is not indicative of the composition of this season's clip.

A combined highest price of R381.00 p/kg was paid for a bale of 24 micron, and a bale of 25 micron kid mohair.

Compared to the previous sale, prices were as follows: Kids (summer) up 2%; Young Goats (summer) up 2%; Fine Adults unchanged; Strong Adults up 4%; average up 2%.

# Market eases with 78% clearance

The 17th sale of the 2016/17 season, held on 9 May, offered 2,018,787 kg. Following recent strong sales, the market eased. Nevertheless, there was good demand with a clearance of 78%.

Compared to the last time sold: Fine Types: 34% cheaper. Medium Types: 25% cheaper. Romney types: 36% cheaper. Mule Types: 25% cheaper. Cheviot Types: Hogs fully firm, others up to 5% cheaper. Radnor Types: Fine fully firm, others 23% cheaper. Welsh Types: generally 35% cheaper. Blackface Types: 3.56% cheaper.
