

The LICC brand is also evidence in the new paradigm of serving our communities in need through our emergency food centers and pantries. We have begun first by identifying those we serve as "Our Neighbors" a term coined by one of our own staff. In our effort to safeguard the dignity of each and every one of our Neighbors, we are naming our food pantries "Food & Boutiques" Services reduce the food pantry

stigma. Our Food & Service Boutiques will continue with the "food choice supermarket" modality while providing an atmosphere that is welcoming and warm. We are eliminating the language "intake process" and replacing with "a welcome reception". In addition to the welcome process, the boutiques will reflect an environment that is cozy and comfortable with couches, hot beverages, plants, magazines, and artwork. It is our hope and prayer to offer a piece of comfort and a peace of mind.
