



# Texas Community College Speech and Theatre Association Technical Theatre Recognition Awards

*Students who make an outstanding contribution of a technical nature to the success of their college's entry in the Play Festival deserve recognition.*

## PRESENTATION:

- Students will display their design contributions both in the performance of the play and in a design presentation during a scheduled time during the Play Festival.
- Students will provide physical evidence of their design process & demonstrate an ability to speak about their process.
  - Physical evidence may include (but is not limited to):
    - Stage Manager's prompt book
    - Designer's research images/sketches/production paperwork/production photos/process shots/instruments/costumes
    - Director's script/rehearsal notes/blocking sketches/concept statements
    - Dramaturg's research/lobby display/study packet
  - Physical evidence must be highly portable & able to be set-up/torn-down within a 10-minute period
- The presentation should not exceed three (3) minutes with an additional two (2) minutes of questioning allowed. The entire presentation should not exceed five (5) minutes.

## ELIGIBILITY:

- Each college is limited to one entry for each category (entry can include more than one person, with a maximum of two people.)
- Entries are determined/nominated by the college's TCCSTA members.
- All entries should be listed on the Play Festival program and be full time students taking at least 9 college hours.

## FACILITIES:

- Presenters will be provided table space for their presentation
- Campus presenters will be grouped together to give voters an idea of the cohesiveness of the entire production.
- Electricity will be provided in the Tech Presentation room by the host campus.
- Wi-Fi will be provided in the Tech Presentation room at the discretion of the host campus

## VOTING & AWARDS:

- Awards are determined by secret ballot collected electronically from the eligible TCCSTA membership.
  - Presenters with a score of 8 to 10 points (Averaged) will be presented a "Superior" certificate
  - Presenters with a score of 5 to 7 points (Averaged) will be presented an "Excellent" certificate
- The top-scoring presentation of the entire festival will be awarded the "John Charles Corley Outstanding Tech Award"
