This themed event explains what role visitors took when coming to the Colonies before 1932. Following the meal, guests will drive to High Amana and visit the High Amana General Store which has changed little from that time. It will offer special hours open to the public that evening from 5-8 pm. There will also be an optional walking tour, wine, appetizers, and mini-desserts along with a 10% discount on merchandise at the store.
