Spiritual Growth Corner by George Kalil

The liturgical season we know as Ordinary Time is coming to an end. The new church year will begin on the first Sunday of Advent,
November 27. This Advent will be a little more special because we will begin using the new translation of the Liturgy, a translation that is closer to the original Latin as well as more Scriptural. If you haven't done so yet, start preparing for this change by finding out what is changing and WHY. You can do this by going to: www.usccb.org, the website for the U.S. Catholic Bishops or to any number of other Catholic websites.

Advent used to be a time of preparation for the birth of Jesus on Christmas; however, it has turned into a time of stress and a buying frenzy as we have lost sight of the true meaning of the season. In the past we treated Advent as a mini-Lent, giving up something or trying to so something extra to help focus our minds and hearts on the upcoming birth of our Savior. Some of us still approach Lent that way. For those who haven't done so lately, let me make a suggestion: try to attend Mass daily or at least once or twice more each week. I know, it means getting up a little earlier each day, but what a wonderful way to prepare for Christmas and to become more familiar with the new translation of the Liturgy!

Sometimes getting ready to prepare for our encounter with Jesus comes from unexpected sources. In the last couple of weeks, I have seen two inspirational movies that I recommend. The first is <u>Courageous</u>, about men standing up for their faith, their wives and their children as true spiritual fathers. While this is a MAN movie with action-chase scenes and all, it would be a good movie for husbands and wives to see together. I went with five other men and then met at a local restaurant to discuss how it might affect us in our daily lives.

The second movie was The Way. It is the story of a man and his son walking the Camino de Santiago de Compostella in Spain. It deals with learning the difference between living the life you choose and choosing to live your life. The scenery is beautiful, and the story is heart-warming. The best part of the whole movie (for me) was a scene near the end at the Cathedral of St. James the Apostle, featuring the giant censer which fills the church with incense and takes eight monks to swing.

You still have time to come to the Council-sponsored series on Catholicism by Fr. Robert Barron on Sundays from 6-7:00 p.m. at the club hall. Episodes 7-10 still remain, and I am sure you will find something in each that will give you food for thought. Finally, remember our 343rd consecutive Rosary will be prayed on Friday, November 4, at St. Vincent's at 7:30. See you there! God Bless!

Spiritual Growth Corner by George Kalil

As I write this, we are two weeks from Christmas. During this season we have many opportunities to go out of our way to do charitable deeds belyond what we normally do. Maybe you helped in some way with the Christmas basket program that helped 600 families in the community. Perhaps you contributed to the Christmas giving program at St. Vincent or St. Thomas. Maybe you let someone into traffic or were extra patient at the check out line because, after all, it is Christmas time. There will no doubt be more chances during our family gatherings for Christmas where we will be more charitable to family members than we are at other times of the year.

Were there also opportunities for patience when someone wouldn't let <u>you</u> into traffic or wasn't as considerate as you thought they should have been? Maybe Uncle Charlie wasn't as willing to be as forgiving during that family gathering as you know you were. Maybe the clerk at the check out just didn't have a clue what he was doing and you were more than happy to let him know that you were aware of it.

The real challenge for this Christmas, as it has been for every Christmas, is to figure out how each one of us is being called by the Holy Spirit to carry that Christmas joy and caring throughout the year. It is easy to be charitable for a short time during the year, but how well do we do in the other 50 weeks? That question is somewhat rhetorical because I don't have an answer for you, but I know who does. I suggest that during the next few weeks of the Christmas season that you spend some quiet time before the manger, whether at church or in the quiet of your own home, and ask Jesus how to keep the spirit of joy and caring throughout the year. Looking at the sweet and innocent face of the baby Jesus may remind you of your own children or grandchildren. Mediate on the great gift that is lying there so peacefully. Then think about the Passion and death of Jesus, which is the reason for this beautiful little Child being born. When we can get our heads and hearts around that, we will be able to put into context the minor sacrifices we are being asked to make to carry the joy of Christmas throughout the remaining 50 weeks of the year.

What a wonderful way to start the other 50 weeks of Christmas, by charitably offering our time to pray the Rosary for those who are ill or homebound.
