
## St. Theresa's Parish News:

This is a devastating time in their lives, but the Church will continue to offer hope and claim its responsibility.


# A Word from Pope Francis

this deeply and we beg forgiveness. -Feast of the Holy Innocents, December 28, 2016



While you give for the needs of your parish, it appears that these lawsuits create a real concern for you. For the most part, awards for lawsuits are paid from two main sources: insurance and the sale of
