It's exciting because it shows how simple it is to let someone know that they matter to us, that we care about their spiritual lives. It tells people that we are not an exclusive "Christian club" that others aren't invited to, but that we are a community ready to welcome new friends, to be a blessing to more and more people.



Another opportunity to invite?

It's exciting because it tells me our folks are asking an important question, "Is this someone who needs to know about God's love, God's grace, God's good plan for their lives?" Inviting people shows our love and concern for them.



So it's really quite a compliment to be invited to share something as personal and important as worship.

It's exciting because it reminds us that God has brought a lot of new people, new families to our church in recent months... to the point that we haven't had a chance to get to know all of the new (and not new) faces that make up the First Baptist Church family.

And I love the story because it shows me the wonderful sense of humor our folks have. At another church I had a member who was very offended that someone didn't know she had been a member for years. But not so in this case. Instead, our First Baptist Church member just laughed it off, and appreciated the humor of getting invited to your own church.

Roll down that window, and invite someone to worship!



In May of 2014, through Compassion International, our church began the sponsorship of Ana, a 12 year old impoverished girl who lives in Africa.




Our desire is to help Ana stay in school and break out of poverty. We want her to know that we care and believe in her.
