→ From the Pastor →

For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

Isaiah 9:6 KJV



Now, wait a minute, you might be thinking. It is barely November, why is she quoting a Christmas scripture? The answer is twofold. First, this is my all-time favorite scripture. Secondly, it describes Jesus...who is more than just the reason for the season. There are at least two other days that we will celebrate before we hear this scripture read. The first is All Saint's Day. Traditionally celebrated the first Sunday in November, it recognizes those who have gone on before us. If it were not for the child described in Isaiah, there would be no place for these saints to go. Heaven would still exist, but human beings would have no way to enter it. We would be dead in our sins. There would be no redemption. There would be no one who died so our sins would be forgiven. There would be no hope of heaven.

This child made entrance to heaven possible.

The second is Thanksgiving. While this is a not necessarily a sacred day, certainly we who profess the Christian faith look at it as a holy day. It is the day we give thanks for all things: the very air we breathe, our surroundings, our families and their safety, our friends, our church family, our God and His Son Jesus Christ. Yes, that child also fits into Thanksgiving. We would not see God's love as clearly if it were not for the Incarnation: the birth of God's son as a human being into our human world. God tried to show us His love in other ways: through Abraham, Moses, the prophets. Human beings did not heed the words and the actions of any of these people. In fact human beings actually killed some of them, so resistant were they to the message being proclaimed. It was after all these events that God sent His Son, so we could not refuse His message of love. Yes, there are some people who still do ignore it, slam the door on it, and run away from it. Those are the people who need to hear about the Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. The season matters not, the message matters most.

We are about to enter the most commercialized season of the year. When you read this, there will probably already be Christmas decorations up in various places. There will certainly be aisles and aisles of Christmas gifts waiting to be purchased. Christmas commercials will already be airing. Please do not succumb to these pressures. This again is where the child comes into play. Here he is the reason not just for the season, but the framework for all of life.

Roof Repair (Finished!)

The new roof involved a complete tear-off of the old roof to include having all layers of the clock tower replaced (the top dome was also silver coated). In addition, the roofing company, Cameron Roofing, placed a new roof on our storage shed roof - complimentary! A quarter of the cost was paid with the money from the NY Landmarks Conservancy's Sacred Sites Grant Program with another quarter of the funding from donations from the church's members and friends. The remainder of our payment came from the church's Endowment fund. The work was done quickly and very professionally with the head of trustees, Nick Glamack, stating, "We were very pleased with Cameron Roofing!"

Handicap Lot

The upper parking lot (off of Routes 5 & 20) that contains our handicapped parking was expanded and new curbs were added. The majority of this project was funded by a memorial gift from Norma Glamack's estate; the reminder came from the church's Memorial Gifts fund. Once the paving was done by the construction company, the curbs were installed by Nick Glamack, Bob Kelly and Judd Rockcastle, an arduous task for which we are very grateful. This labor intensive job also included trimming the overgrown bushes that lined the south wall of the church. The church extends its deepest gratitude to the men who dedicated their afternoon.

Stewardship Campaign

This is the time of year that the trustees plan our church finances for the next year. Part of the process is our stewardship campaign to ask members for support. Pledge cards have been mailed to church members and friends of the church. If you received a pledge request, please keep these words in mind: "It's not always about how much we have but how we use what we have to serve God. As Christian stewards, we are expected to give back to the Lord our time, money and talent in order to expand His work." 

Hunter McDermott is on a quest to track down his birth mother. After receiving more media attention than he could ever want for




