This past week you should have received a letter from the church to remind you how important you are as a member of the Gothenburg United Methodist Church and as part of the body of Christ. In the letter we asked you to prayerfully consider how you can help in the mission of the United Methodist Church.

We are a church connected globally: We are asked to become a member of The United Methodist Church, a global web of local congregations. All members of every congregation are joined to all others across the globe, which is an exciting part of what it means to be the church. Take for example "Rise against Hunger" and "Operation Christmas Child". Though we may never meet one another, we are making great things happen. Lives are being changed in ways no one of us, nor any single congregation, could do on our own.

<u>We are a church connected locally:</u> We ask new members to commit to the people with whom they worship every Sunday. We vow to be part of the body of Christ in our local community, and to support it as well.

As members we take vows. Each of us was asked to do all in their power to support each member. We vow to take Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior and to believe in the Christian faith as contained in the Old and New Testaments. We promise to live a Christian life and to support the United Methodist Church with our prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. Church membership is not about privileges, such as assigned pews or getting to the front of the line at our church dinners. Rather it is a call to participate as part of a fellowship of followers of Jesus Christ who seek to make the world more like the Kingdom of God.

Pastor's Perspective

Our Praise Band rehearses almost every Tuesday night—even during the summer months. Last Tuesday, when we had finished rehearsing the music for worship on Sunday morning, someone mentioned that one of the songs from the previous Sunday had been running through their mind all week. "Could we sing 'You Say'?" this person asked. So, even though it was already 8:00 p.m., everyone else smiled in agreement and we pulled it up on the screen. We sang with enthusiasm and at the end we were quite certain that we had done a fine job of praising God as we sang together. It was a great rehearsal.

As I walked home, I reflected on how much I enjoy singing with this Praise Band. I enjoy the ways we sound together, yes, but it is so much more than that. It is the times we laugh together, and I love how we work collaboratively to figure out the best way to present each song. We work with our amazing Tech Crew in the sound booth—who are often providing drum beats as well as helping us blend well. Occasionally, we even get help from the sound booth personnel with singing when we are a little "thin" up front. I appreciate that the members of the Praise Band welcomed me and made room for me to sing with them, especially since I knew virtually none of the music we sing when I came to Gothenburg two years ago.

Besides the delight of making music, what I am experiencing is the power of small group dynamics. Small groups allow us to develop relationships that are difficult to do in groups with larger numbers (like an entire congregation). In a small group we can see who is missing, and we recognize that we—as a group—are less whenever anyone is absent. We can help one another to improve when we are in a small group because we can recognize one another's strengths—and weaknesses. We can hold each other accountable for our attitudes and behaviors...we can more easily appreciate each other and build one another up; we do so because we benefit as a group when individual members improve.

Jesus recognized the value of small groups, too. He gathered around him 12 disciples that he spent a great deal of time with. He very particularly taught

them things that he did not teach to the larger gatherings that followed him. He worked with them very intentionally because he knew that he would not be with them forever. He taught them things that he expected them to use when they eventually would establish their own small groups—growing home churches that spread the love of God around the world

2000 years later, here we are, continually looking for ways to spread the Good News of Jesus the Christ to the world. And the answer for us is the same as it was for the early Church: meet in small groups wherever people gather; tell the stories of how Jesus has transformed your life and invite others to share their experiences. Simple. And yet so apparently difficult for us. Especially in the summer, we seem to be in so many different places, and Sundays are no longer the day set aside only for church. It seems increasingly important to me that we need to take advantage of all those other opportunities—at the lake, the ballpark, the golf course, the coffee shop, the library, the theater (or theatre), the concert hall, the Farmer's Market and craft fairs, at camp (church/4-H/music/wrestling/YMCA/computer/etc), auctions and rodeos, the YMCA and the Senior Center, the bar, the restaurant, your class reunion and your company picnic...all those places where we go and all those places we gather...to share how God is working in our lives. It is these small gatherings that provide the opportunity to give voice to the ways God is important to us—and God can use the small group to change us all for the better.

There are so many options! Our relationship with God is no longer limited to Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings! God is not held within the confines of Temple or Church walls! We are invited to explore our relationship with God within our relationships with others, and when we do so, we find that we can share God in all times and places, and our world will be transformed! I pray that you are enjoying your summer, and that God is finding a place in all that you say and all that you do. Blessings! Pastor Jamie
