

"Salvation Isn't What It Used To Be for the Army"

"We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God; and that they only constitute the Divine rule of Christian faith and practice." The Doctrines of the Salvation Army

Founded in 1865 in London by William and Catherine Booth, the Salvation Army has long had a great reputation in both the secular world and the Christian world. Its mission statement declares, "Its mission is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in His name without discrimination." That sounds like something that all of us Christians could support. Many of us have made contributions to their red kettles in the Christmas season.

In 2020 the Salvation Army brought in \$4.2 billion (\$1 billion more than in the non-covid year of 2019), \$2.3 billion of which came from the public. The Army has operations in 131 countries and helps many needy people. The Salvation Army of Southern Nevada says that it helped 91,541 people in this part of the state in 2020.

Despite the Army's claim to follow only the Bible, its stance on social issues has weakened in recent years. Traditionally its international council has declared, "The Salvation Army believes in the sanctity of all human life" In 2010 the council said that cases of incest and rape justify abortion.

In 2012 the SA issued a position paper in which it said, "Homosexual practice however, is, in the light of Scripture, clearly unacceptable." Now the US SA has a web page where it expresses its support of the LGBTQ community. "Our hiring practices are open to all, and we provide the same benefits to opposite-sex and same-sex couples." SA's Communications and Marketing Manager Ken Forsythe, a gay man, explains, "I've been with my now spouse for 14 and a half years. I've been accepted by my peers for who I am.... No one's trying to change me. No one's trying to convert me." Salvation and conversion used to be central to the mission of the SA.

In April an SA international commission issued a guide entitled "Let's Talk about Racism." The document says that white Americans should "stop trying to be colorblind." Martin Luther King used to preach that all Americans should judge people by the content of their character and not by the color of their skin. This document appeared to promote a critical race theory approach to ethnic diversity.

The web site of the national SA also seems to embrace transgenderism. Certainly as Christians we can support the idea that Christian churches and organizations should reach out to needy people of all kinds. Our church has been very involved in prison ministry. But that does not mean that we support crime. In the same way it is disappointing to see that the SA is seemingly supporting unbiblical behavior.

No doubt the SA has felt pressure to compromise its positions for the sake of corporate and government donations. The pull of the world system around us is strong. But we Christians cannot compromise our commitment to the Bible and its standards. (Christian Post, 12/5/2021, 12/19/2021) (salvationarmyusa.org)
