John B. CAMERON

My Great Great Grandfather

John B. CAMERON was my Great Great Grandfather. He was born in Cumberland County, NC about 1814. His parents were Alexander CAMERON and Nancy McARTHUR. John married Elizabeth? I have never found her maiden name or where they were married. They migrated to Madison County, FL, along with Alexander, Nancy and his brother William James CAMERON, a few years before the 1850 Madison County, FL census record was taken. In the Madison County, Florida Genealogical News, on page 61, Volume 13, Issue 2, April-June 2008, John B. CAMERON is listed as having land for the date of 2/16/1846, in Township 1 South Range 7 East, Section 5, NE ¼ of NE ¼ on page 138. The page number, being from the original source records, is located in the office of Glenn SMITH'S Abstract and Title Company, Madison, Florida. We know from this record that John B. was in Madison County at least by 1846. On the first day of November in 1848, John B. was issued a land certificate, number 8,902, for land in Madison County, FL listed as follows: the North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section 5, in Township one South, of Range Seven East in the district of lands subject to sale at Tallahassee, Florida containing Forty Acres, and fourteen hundredths of an acre. This description is the same as the one described in the above listing. Then on the 15th day of March in the year 1852, I have a deed that I obtained from the Madison County court house with John B. buying land from his brother William James CAMERON. This land is described as follows: All that lot or portion of lying in Madison County and the State afore said: The Southwest quarter of the North West quarter of Section 4 in Township one of Range seven South and East containing 40 acres more or less. From this deed we solve the puzzle of James's name; he is listed as William James CAMERON. The witnesses on this deed were Neil CAMPBELL and Thomas C. McLAIN. On the date of June 2, 1848, John B. is a witness on a deed for Nancy OVERSTREET who is selling land to his brother, William James CAMERON. Nancy was the wife of the late Silas OVERSTREET. Could this Nancy be one of Alexander's daughters? A Mrs. W. ABBOT was also a witness on this deed. In the 1850 Madison County, Florida Slave Schedule, on page 751 John B. CAMERON is listed as being the owner of 1 male slave, 3 female slaves.

Alexander CAMERON, the father of John B., was born about 1772 in Cumberland County, NC. John's mother, Nancy McARTHUR was born about 1786. I have not proved who Alexander's father was. It has been reported that Alexander was the son of "Hill" Daniel CAMERON of Cumberland County, NC. "Hill" Daniel's children were as follows: Daniel, Kenneth, Allen who married Issabella CAMPBELL, John who married Jane DOBBINS, Alexander who married Nancy McARTHUR, and Catherine who married John "Taylor" CAMERON. "Hill" Daniel was one of the first ruling elders in the Barbeque Presbyterian Church in Cumberland County, NC. His name is always listed in church history books of the early Presbyterian churches in North Carolina. These CAMERONS were of Scottish descent from, *Arcyle-Shire, Scotland*, and were in Cumberland County, NC as early as 1767. Argyll is a county in the South West part of Scotland, and this is the area from which "Hill" Daniel CAMERON migrated. Alexander married Nancy McARTHUR on November 26, 1804, and there is a record of their marriage in Cumberland County, NC. The two sons of Alexander and Nancy that I have found were the ones listed on the 1850 Madison County, FL census record. There is no real proof of that they were his sons except they were living right by each other in that census record. He had 4 females other than Nancy listed in the 1820 Cumberland County, NC census, and these were probably his daughters. I have never found any information on these daughters. I did receive a family file that lists an Elizabeth CAMERON as Alexander's daughter. The file states that she married John Berrian BOWEN. There is a family of CAMERONS living in Tattnall County, GA in the early census records, but they were listed as Allan CAMERON Jr. and Sr. I didn't find my Alexander or John B. there in the 1840 census along with these other Tattnall County, CAMERON'S so I can't really say they belong to my family of CAMERON'S.

I found Alexander on the 1820 Cumberland County, NC census. He lists that he has two boys under 10, 1 male 45 and up, 3 females under 10, 1 female 26 and under 45, (Nancy) and one female 45 and up. (Who could this be?) She could have been either Alexander's mother or Nancy's. Alexander would have been 48 in this census, and Nancy would have been 34. I could not find them in the 1830-40 census records, but by the 1850 Madison County,

FL record, they are living in Madison County, the 11th Division. This census was taken on the 29th day of November in the year 1850, and they are listed on page 105 as follows:

I am assuming these men, listed next to Alexander in this census, are his sons. The question and family puzzle pieces are: where are his girls listed as under 10 in the 1820 census? Could they have come to Madison with Alexander, but were married by then. Could the women listed in that same census record living close to him be his daughters? Someone with a **CAMERON** Family Bible could probably answer these questions.

Somewhere between the 1850 and the 1860 census record, John B. and Alexander must have died. Elizabeth, the wife of John B. is living as head of household in the 1860 Madison County, FL census, and John B. is not there. James is listed first in the census, and he lists his family as follows:

Note: James was listed as James in the 1850 census; W.J. must have been his legal name. Also the James listed as James's son in the 1850 census is now listed as John. Later on this John is also known as John D. W. J. **CAMERON** married Sarah H. **MASHBORN** in Madison County, FL on November 27, 1849. On page 5 in the HISTORY OF MADISON COUNTY FLORIDA, written by Elizabeth **SIMMS**, W.J. **CAMERON** is listed as one of the early members of the Moseley Hall Lodge along with Amon **DeLAUGHTER**, who married Anna E. **CAMERON**, daughter of John B., the subject of this report.

In this 1860 census, Elizabeth lists her name as E.A. **CAMERON**, and she lists her family as follows: page 177

Note: Amanda is missing from this census; she was the oldest child in the 1850 census. Had she died by the taking of this census? As Samuel was their last child, and he would have been born in 1857, then John B. would have died about 1856. I note that Nancy **McARTHUR-CAMERON**, wife of Alexander, is not living with either Elizabeth nor James; she must have died by the time this census was taken, or she could be living with one of her other children. I have not found her in the 1860 census record as of this date. Nancy **CAMERON**, daughter of John B is also missing from this census. She would have been 13 in this census record. I have not found any other information on Nancy.

Living in the same neighborhood and listed a few homes away from Elizabeth is the family of Amon **DeLAUGHTER** and they are listed as follows:

In the 1867 census, on page 1, W. J. **CAMERON** and Mrs. E.A. **CAMERON**, -widow of John B, are listed on the same page, along with A. **DeLAUGHTER**, as follows:

CAMERON, W J---1 male over 21, 4 males under 21, 1 female over 18, 1 female under 18, total in house, 7 and 1 male between 18 and 45.

CAMERON, Mrs E.A.---1 male over 21, 3 males under 21, 2 females over 18, 1 female under 18, total in home, 7, and 1 male between 18 and over 45.

DeLAUGHTER, A---1 male over 21, 1 male under 21, 1 female over 18, 1 female under 18, total in house, 4 and 0 males between 18 and 45.

Notes for 1867 census: The one male over 21 must have been a son-in-law as John B. had died by now, and Nancy and John B. had only the two sons, Louis Franklin and Samuel Batie, or a male that was staying with them and helping out around the farm. . The three males under 21 are Louis Franklin, my Great Grandfather, age 16 and Samuel Batie, age 9 and possibly George **KIMBREW**, who would have been age 6 in this census. The two females over 18 would have been Elizabeth (Lizzie) as she didn't marry Darling **VANN** until 1880, and she was 22 in this census, and Catherine, who would have been 26 in this census. Catherine married John R. **KIMBREW** in 1866. and she could be living with her mother at this time, and the male over 21 could be her husband. The one girl under 18 was Issabella. She was 13 in this census. This census says there is a total of 7 in this family, but if you count E.A., there would be 8.

Note: Also on the same page is listed O.E. **SULLIVAN** who was listed as Amon **DeLAUGHTER'S** brother-in-law in the book, THE HISTORY OF MADISON COUNTY, FL on page 53, and O.E. **SULLIVAN** is listed as one of the early members of the Moseley Hall Lodge on page 50 in the same book.

By the 1870 Madison County, FL census record, only two of Elizabeth's daughters were living with her. I have not found any information on Amanda or Nancy as of the writing of this report. Catherine married John R. **KIMBREW** on May 17, 1866 and Anna E. had married Amon **DeLAUGHTER** on February 14, 1861. On the Madison County, FL census record taken in July 20th of 1870, I found Elizabeth still living close to Amon **DeLAUGHTER** in the census. Elizabeth lists her family as follows:

Note: I think they put the wrong place of birth for Elizabeth in this census. In the 1860 census, she is listed as being born in NC. On the next page, listed right after Batie's listing in the census record, there is listed a George **KIMBREW** age 9 and a Rachel **WHITHURST** age 7. The census starts over with the numbering of the households and lists George **KIMBREW'S** household as #1 and Rachel is listed right under George, but she is listed as a servant. Both of these children are listed as being born in Florida. The way the census reads it looks like they have their own household, but I don't think children that young would have their own household, and I think they were part of Elizabeth's household. George is living with my Great Grandfather, Louis Franklin **CAMERON** in the 1880 census and is listed as a nephew. To be his nephew, George would have to be the son of one of his sisters. Catherine **CAMERON**, Louis Franklin's sister, married John R. **KIMBREW** on May 17 1866. Where is

Catherine in this census? The only way for this to work would be that George is the son of Catherine and John R. **KIMBREW**, but George is too old as they didn't marry until 1866, and George was born in 1861. Note: There is a John **KIMBREW** listed living close in the same neighborhood, but he is listed as living alone; there is no Catherine living with him. I would assume Catherine has died by now, as I have found no other information on her. It seems that George was the son of John **KIMBREW**, and was Catherine's stepson by marriage.

Living right above her in this 1870 census is **DeLAUGHTER**, and he lists his family as follows:

Note: They listed Amon as Simon in this census; also listed Ann as being born in SC, which is wrong, as she was born in FL or GA. Amon's place of birth is wrong in this census also; he was born in SC.

I could not find Elizabeth in the 1880 census record. Some of her children are still living in Madison County, Florida, but either she has left the area or has died by then.

On the 14th day of June in 1880, Amon **DeLAUGHTER** is found listed in the Madison County, Florida census record as follows:

Living in the next household there is a Belle **BOYD**. Now we know from the marriage records of Madison County, that Issabella **CAMERON**, daughter of John B. and Elizabeth married W.R. **BOYD** on September 1, 1878. W. R. is missing from this census and Issabella is listed as Bell **BOYD**. Where is W. R. **BOYD**? I didn't find him in any of the other census records, and Belle isn't found in the later census records. She could have remarried after this census. Belle lists a daughter named W.E. **BOYD**.

Bell is listed in the 1880 census as follows:

All of the children that Elizabeth listed living with her in the 1870, namely, Lizzie, Franklin, Issabella and Batie are married by the 1880 census record. Lizzie (Elizabeth) married Darling **VANN** on January 11, 1880, so they should have been on this census, but I couldn't find Lizzie. The family puzzle piece is: where is Darling **VANN** and Lizzie in the later census records? I could not find them at all after searching the later census records for Darling **VANN** and Lizzie. There is an Emory **VANN** in the records.

Franklin (Louis), my Great Grandfather, and the first son of John B., married Sarah Eugenia **PATTERSON** on May 9, 1875, and their lives are documented in the report SARAH EUGENIA **PATTERSON CAMERON SESSIONS** in the October-December issue of The Madison County, Florida Genealogical news on page 142.

Samuel Batie **CAMERON**, the last child born to John B. and Elizabeth was born in 1858. He married Mary Rebecca **PATTERSON**, daughter of Andrew Elkins **PATTERSON**, on September 6, 1885 in Madison County, FL Book B page 682.

I could not find Samuel on the 1880 Madison County, Florida census record, but by the 1900 Madison County, Florida census record, he is married and is living in the Moseley Hall area of Madison County. His age is 42 and his family is listed as: Mary R. **CAMERON**, wife, 34, Eugene B. **CAMERON**, son, age 11, Agnes B. **CAMERON**, daughter, age 7 and Patterson, son age 4.

By the 1910 census record, Samuel has moved his family to Fort Myers, Lee, Florida. He is still married to Mary R. and lists his children as follows: Belmont E. (Eugene) **CAMERON**, age 21, Agnes B. **CAMERON**, age 17, Patterson **CAMERON**, age 14 and Clyde **CAMERON**, age 7.

In the 1920 census, Samuel is living in Homestead, FL. He is a truck farmer and living with him are his wife, Mary R. 54, Patterson, 23 and Clyde 17. By 1930, Samuel and Mary are living alone in Homestead, FL. Their son, Patterson, whose full name was Samuel Patterson **CAMERON**, filled out a WW I registration card. It stated he had blue eyes, brown hair and that his right leg was short. He worked for Economy Grocery in Miami, Florida. He stated that his mother was Mary Rebecca **CAMERON** and that his father's birthplace was Moseley Hall, Florida. In 1919 Patterson filed for a passport to go to Cuba to investigate fruit growing conditions. This passport also stated he was crippled in his right leg.

Samuel Batie **CAMERON** and Mary Rebecca **PATTERSON-CAMERON'S**, son, Eugene Belmont **CAMERON**, is found in the 1920 census living with his wife, Ruth E. and daughter, Winifred age 3 years and 6 months. By 1930, Eugene and family are living in Miami, Dade County, FL. Eugene lists his age as 40, Ruth E., his wife, is age 33 and his daughter, Winifred is 13. Eugene also filled out a passport in 1919 stating his father was Samuel **CAMERON**; that his father's residence was Homestead, FL. He said on the passport that he was going to Cuba, Isle of Pines for recreation. It looks like two of Samuel Batie's sons went to Cuba in that year. By the 1945 census, Eugene is still living in Dade County, FL and lists his address as 768 NW 50th St. and that he is a salesman. His wife, Ruth E. is still with him and is listed as 48 in this census. Eugene died July 1957 in Dade County, FL.

Clyde **CAMERON**, son of Samuel Batie **CAMERON** and Mary R. **PATTERSON-CAMERON** was living in Dade County, FL in 1945 also, and with him was his mother, Mary R. She lists her age as 79 and Clyde is 42. Clyde is listed as a fruit packer.

Tidbit for Daniel **CAMERON**: Daniel **CAMERON**, and Archibald **BUIE**, were the earliest Elders of Barbeque Church.

In conclusion, I have never found any of the gravesites for the **CAMERON'S**. I know they are probably buried in Madison County, but I can't find their graves. I thought they possibly could be buried in the Old Oakland Cemetery, but if they are, there are no stones for them. Alexander and John B. died before the 1860 census record. Anyone with any information on these **CAMERON'S**, please let us know.

Just Exactly What is GPS? Why Do I Care?

GPS stands for “Global Positioning System.” It is a satellite-based navigation system that is operated by the Department of Defense. The system, comprised of 24 satellites, ground-based control stations, and GPS receivers, provides us with such things as location, instructions from one place to another, time of day, and at least a dozen other elements. More importantly, it is available for your use in your genealogy research. All you need is a GPS receiver as the rest is provided by the military.

But, just why should you care about this technology and what can it do for you and your genealogy research? Well, if you have ever roamed the countryside hunting an old family burial plot or a cemetery that could hold secrets to your family history, you just might be able to use a GPS. Of course, every GPS receiver is slightly different and offers different capabilities. But most provide exactly what you need and that is directions to where you want to go and an ability to capture information on where you are. An added incentive is that the prices have dropped dramatically in the last few years.

To use GPS to go to a specific place, you need to start with the specific address, the address of someplace nearby, intersections or the actual coordinates of the place you wish to visit. The physical address can be obtained from phone books, over the web, etc. And the coordinates can often be found on the web, in specific cemetery books, or from a nearby funeral home. Imagine locating your family cemetery on a map, entering a nearby cross-roads or the actual street into your GPS device, and then hearing and seeing turn-by-turn directions on how to get there, even if it's hundreds of miles from your home.

Just as important is the capability you have to use GPS to document the location of a long lost grave site. Once you have found it through whatever means available, you can enter the coordinates of the individual graves in your hand-held GPS to record the exact location so those graves are never lost. Anyone can find the grave sites again with your GPS coordinates and their GPS receiver. Remember, unless you have an extremely expensive GPS, the coordinates won't take you to the exact spot, but should get you within about 15 yards.

There are basically two broad categories of receivers: 1) recreational and 2) map and survey grade. For our purposes, the recreational-grade receivers are the most appropriate. They are quite accurate and relatively inexpensive, although with increasing price, more features are available. The basic handheld GPS receiver is your cheapest option and is well suited for use in the field while hunting that elusive cemetery. Talk with others who use a GPS receiver to help determine the most appropriate one available for you.

Legislative Petitions

We are all constantly seeking new sources of information on our family history. One option not often considered is that of Legislative Petitions. A petition is a written plea from citizens to the government seeking a redress of grievances or asking relief. This often is an overlooked source for genealogy research. Petitions can be of great value to both genealogists and historians. They can help establish an ancestor's location at a given time and can yield important information about his (and sometimes her) personal circumstances, opinions on local issues, special challenges facing either an individual or a community, statements of fact, and general history. Although difficult to access due to the lack of comprehensive indexes, petitions are often well worth the extra effort. Petitions can provide you such things as: links of an ancestor to a place, family information or background, neighbors and their interactions, insight into an ancestor's views and lifestyle, others with common associations and/or views, depositions or supporting statements from neighbors or relatives and sometimes original signatures.

Petitions provided a means by which citizens could ask for a special dispensation for himself or for someone else. Groups of citizens often signed petitions in an attempt to sway legislative action with the weight of their numbers. Although petitions cover a wide range of subjects, the following are some of the most common: formation of new counties, internal improvements, relief from taxes due to infirmity or age or widowhood, divorce, land boundaries, land grants, clemency for a lawbreaker, a neighbor's potentially harmful actions, roads, and slavery.

The collection of legislative petitions at the Library of Virginia is one of the most comprehensive. Unfortunately, they do not have every petition ever submitted to the Virginia legislature. Many were quite legally withdrawn from the legislative clerk's office; others were lost. Nevertheless, the collection contains more than 20,000 items ranging from 1776 to 1865 as well as a few petitions made to the House of Burgesses in 1774 and a few addressed to the Convention held during the Revolution, in 1775. Originally the petitions were filed in chronological order as presented to the General Assembly. In the first decades of the twentieth century, these petitions were rearranged by county or city of origin, chronologically within each location. The collection maintains this arrangement today. A number of archivists and staff librarians have undertaken various projects to identify, date, and conserve the petitions. The collection includes a large file marked "Miscellaneous Petitions," containing dated petitions to which it has been impossible to assign a county or city, such as petitions from persons living outside Virginia, petitions from groups such as the Presbytery of Hanover, and petitions from individuals whose location is not identified.

Records to Examine in the Court House

Going into the County Court House can be quite overwhelming. In the Madison County court house, much of what you normally want to look at is located upstairs on the main floor. The books are large and heavy which can be a challenge, but they are easily accessible. There are many others however located downstairs and they are the challenge the Society is looking forward to attacking. The following are some of the documents recommended for research. Some records are given different titles based on the specific state or county in which they are located.

- Marriage Records
- Deed Records
- Probate Records
- Minute and Court Order Books
- Common Pleas and Quarter Sessions
- Superior Court; Chancery Court
- Prothonotary (a chief clerk in certain courts of law)
- Justice of the Peace Registers
- Doctor Registers
- Attorney Registers
- Orphans Court
- Tax Lists
- Loose paper files
- Naturalization papers
- General Estate Index
- Devisors/Devises Index

Abstracting a Will

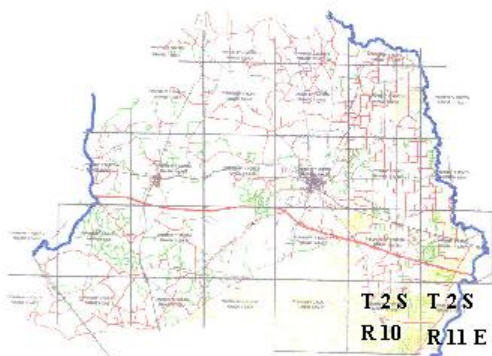
As our Society prepares to dig into the documents that are located in the Madison County Courthouse, we thought it would be good to see what others recommend. This addresses some of the items recommended by other Genealogy Societies. They highly recommend that special effort is taken to capture the following:

- Volume number, page and date of the document
- Complete name of the testator, exactly as it appears
- Occupation of testator, if shown
- Complete listing of bequests and devises (for personal and real property) with a special effort to capture the names exactly as they are shown along with any designations such as father, sister, etc.
- Special clauses such as “former wife” or “land received from my uncle”
- Name(s) of the executor(s)
- Special clauses providing for apprenticeship of children, burial place, mention of religion, etc.
- Signatures as they appeared (exact spelling), annotate whether they were done by signature or by mark
- Exact names of witnesses, include residences or other information available on the witnesses
- Date of the will, and date the will was presented in court for probate
- Notate the exact source to include citation, county, state, book, page, etc.
- Attempt to annotate if you are looking at the exact will or the clerk’s transcribed copy.

Abstracting a Deed

Very similar to abstracting a will, there are some very specific items that should be captured if they are available. Some of those are:

- Names of the parties involved (grantors and grantees)
- Residences and occupations of the parties
- Consideration “paid”
- Description of the property being sold
- Names of adjoining property owners mentioned
- Any special wording that might help identify the parties or the property
- Signatures or marks exactly as they appeared
- Names of witnesses exactly as they appeared
- Date, place and by whom deed was acknowledged
