Sister Daisy Bush, First Vice President, presented President Silva to give the President's report for the 2020-2021 conference year of the faithful, fearless, fantastic Florida Conference Women's Missionary Society. Sister Silva highlighted the activities and stewardship of the Florida Conference Women's Missionary Society including reports of the Conference Officers and Area Societies.

Sister Lomar Barkley moved to approve the President's report. Sister Deana McAllister seconded the motion. The vote was 117 yes votes and 0 no votes to adopt the motion.

Election Process

Supervisor Marlaa Hall Reid conducted the election of officers.

Sister Lucy Pride, registration committee chair, read the registration report and moved to accept the report as read. The motion was adopted with 120 votes yes and 0 votes no to accept the report.

Sister Lomar Barkley, credential committee chair, read the credential report and moved to receive the report. The motion was adopted with 117 yes votes and 2 no votes.

Greetings.

The 2021-22 Conference Year has been one of great fruits and great sacrifice. Our conference in keeping with the self-wellness theme established a new budget committee chaired by the Conference Treasurer and comprised of each area's treasurer along with our1st Vice President, Sis. Daisy Bush. Each Area Chair was also invited to participate. The committee held three budget meetings this conference year, each with a specific focus:

- Budget Training 101 basic understanding of a budget, its development and use,
- Budget Comparison review of current budget vs actual budget and trends for past three years, and
- Budget Development development of the 2021-22 conference year budget recommendation.

The committee identified three areas and made three recommendations along with its budget recommendations:

- Establish a disaster relief fund as part of our disaster preparation plans,
- Establish a benevolence fund for unique situations, and
- Increase conference dues by \$5 dollars to be allocated to the following:
 - \$3 to the benevolence fund
 - \$2 to the disaster relief fund

Also adopted were new reporting and voucher forms. Beginning October 1, these forms will be in full use at the Conference and Area levels. We are also hoping our local churches will adopt similar formats, which will aid in our annual reporting.

The conference received great financial support from our missionaries, pastors, family and friends. As we continue to rebound from COVID and other life changing events, the conference remained gracious in its giving. Revenues including balance brought forward last year, totaled

more than \$98,000. Our expenditures totaled more than \$86,000, which included \$49,000 for the Episcopal Budget. This does not include funds raised/expended for projects and services at the local level.

Moving into the 2023 Conference year, training for our Area and Local Treasurers will remain our top priority. The training will be critical to the successful implementation and use of the newly adopted forms. The new forms are attached with this report along with the itemized annual treasurer's report.

In closing, it is a pleasure to serve as your Conference Treasurer. Thank you for entrusting me with your vote of confidence. I pledge to continue to ensure and promote integrity and accountability in our financial processes. Your support, prayers and kind words are heartfelt and encourage me daily as I strive to give you my best, always!


