

#### By Laws of the

#### **Apostolic Faith Bible College**

Article VII—Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians) and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

\*Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit

\*Creation and Formation

'Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation

\*Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

\*Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body, a Second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ

\*Baptism of the Holy Spirit, evidenced by the speaking in other languages

\*Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit

\*Sacrament of the Lord's Supper

\*Washing of Feet

\*Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers

\*Do not condone divorce and remarriage

\*Destruction of the Wicked

\*Conditional Immortality

\*Rapture of the Man child Class

\*Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly

\*A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above basic doctrines.



#### 60th Anniversary

1958-2018

Roland Haney and Loretta Babb met at the Hinton, AL church in 1958, the same church where Roland was saved as an adult in a Sunday night service under Bro. Earl Morgan's ministry. Loretta had been saved in Follett, TX when she was 10 years old. She and Barbara (Haines) Foster went to the Hinton church in the gospel work with the L.J. Ehrlich's to hold a revival, after finishing one term at the Apostolic Faith Bible College (AFBC) in Baxter Springs, KS. Roland lived near the Hinton church. He had already been in the US Army two years and had served in Italy during that time. He was still in the reserves when he and Loretta met. He was walking to the Hinton church with his cousin, Bryant Carney. Though very bashful, when Roland saw Loretta he said to his cousin, "That one is mine."

Roland and Loretta helped to clear the grounds for the building of the camp at Pine Crest, MS. Three months after they met, they were married. (Roland asked

Loretta what she thought about marrying a preacher. She told him she had always wanted to marry a preacher!) They were married on Aug. 16, 1958 at the Follett Chapel, Follett, TX.

As does anyone who feels completely unworthy, Roland wrestled with the call on his life to preach, but he answered in obedience. He and Loretta lived in Pampa, TX until time to go to AFBC, which had its term beginning at the first of the year back then. Bro. Gail and Sis. Edna Schultz, Bro. Robert Girouard (who was also superintendent), and Bro. Harold Bollinger were some of the teachers that year. Ted and Deanna Barker, Jack Cornell, Kathryn (Booth) Cornell, and Jim Morris were some of the students that year. Several student's weddings took place the summer after AFBC, like those of Homer and Sue Allen and Danny and Pat Robinson. The Haney's later pastored at Snell, MS. Their son, Marty, was born during this time. They also pastored at Crosses, AR. Their son, Warren, was born during this time. They pastored at Cave Springs, AR, Crosses, AR again, Woodward, OK, Shattuck, OK and Edna, TX. They lived at Follett, TX in between pastorates. #### Greetings From the Panhandle!

My life changed completely two years ago when God asked me to move. Leaving my home. My family, my friends, my security was THE hardest and scariest thing I have ever done. I couldn't understand what God could possibly have in store for me. I'm ashamed to say I fought God. I tried desperately to reason my way out of the move, to explain to God why I shouldn't go but eventually I obeyed. I moved to the panhandle on Aug. 25, 2016 and my life has never been the same.



I came to Follett, TX with the mindset that God was going

to use me in some way to minister to the youth here and boy oh boy was I wrong. While yes I have been involved in the "ministry" and yes I'm sure God has used me in some way while I've been here, the majority of my time here in the panhandle and at the Filling Station has been filled with new friends and youth teaching me and pushing me in my walk with the Lord. I have had the honor of working under and alongside amazing leaders who have called me deeper into true relationship with Jesus Christ and I am continually amazed by the lessons I learn from the teens each week through their openness and desire for more of God.

The Filling Station is a place that was created to invoke an atmosphere of passionate pursuing and freedom. It is a place for youth, from all walks of life, to come together and for a brief moment in time not worry about the stigma of "popular" or "unpopular" or the worries and standards the world forces on them. It's a place of safety and encounter. In two years I have witnessed (and experienced) deliverance in the hearts of many. I've seen teens give their hearts to God, teens learning to walk in the gifts of God has given them, and watched hearts of stone melt into pure and soft and tender hearts that desire only more of the Lord. We have taken mission trips and I have listened to teens open up about their lives, struggles, and the change God is making in their hearts. I've watched them go above and beyond to serve (like Christ) in tough and uncomfortable places. I've been challenged by their willingness and encouraged by the visible works of God. I hear many people speak, in anticipation of a "coming" revival whether in their church, their city, or our nation; but, I propose this thought for you to ponder. Revival is here. It doesn't start with a flyer or a fancy preacher. It starts in the small "yes". The day by day encounter with God. The spark on your own heart that is fueled until it grows and spreads to those around. Revival is in you. It's in me. It's our desire and active obedience to passionately pursue God.

I look back on the time I've spent here and realize... I've encountered revival everyday. A group of 50-75 teens and adults with a few things in common, coming together and experiencing the presence of God, the fruit of encounter, and the excitement of relationship with Christ. If that's not revival... What is?

I thank God for pushing beyond my comfort zone and for giving me opportunity to be a part of something so amazing. I look forward to the coming years with the Filling Station and the plans God has for us all.

I reached over and told my wife, she immediately began researching and said we need to go to the ER, sounds like a thunderclap headache. Mona got the truck and drove it around back of the house. She helped me to the truck but I could hardly walk, my speech was slurred and I couldn't see very well. She tried holding me up and walking me but I was pulling away from her without trying. Finally got in the truck and off to the hospital we went getting there about 4:40 a.m.

Mona called Bro. Randy Dalton and told him to pray. She called our daughter Victoria Segura, our son Kendrick and our daughter Laticia Glenn to let them know what was going on. They all began to pray for me!

A nurse helped me out of the truck into a wheelchair into the ER room. They began to give me something for the headache in the IV line but it wasn't helping very much.
