

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Christ the King Sunday Year B

"My kingdom does not belong to this world", Jesus tells Pilate (Jn 18:36). So true! Jesus is a king like no other. He leads His people by serving them, and willingly giving and sacrificing His life so that His subjects may have life, and life to the fullest (John 10:10). His kingly authority was His lowly service. We can recall how he entered triumphantly into Jerusalem not in a golden chariot or on a majestic thoroughbred, but on a simple donkey. John 12:14-15 tells us that, "Jesus found a donkey and sat upon it, as is written: "Fear no more, O daughter Zion; see, your king comes, seated upon an ass's colt." Jesus is a humble king, not attached to pageantry and self-promotion. The day before entering Jerusalem on a donkey here, Jesus had been anointed king. *His feet* were anointed by Mary, (John 12:3). Saul, Solomon and David were anointed on their heads (1 Sam 10:1)! Why is Jesus anointed a 'king' differently by receiving oil on his feet? Because Jesus 'walks' with His people – walks in their own footsteps with them, and power is not a 'head-trip' (go to his head) for Jesus. Also, Isaiah 52:7 had prophesied that "How *beautiful....* are the *feet* of the one bringing good news, announcing peace..." So Jesus is clearly as king unlike any typical earthly king. Worldly kings are often consumed with building campaigns of monuments and memorials, yet Jesus' building campaign is 'building up His People'. Jesus says such when He tells Peter in Matthew 16:18, "you are Peter, upon this rock I will build my church....". Recall that King David and King Solomon desire to build a glorious Temple Monument (God's or THIERS). Their capital campaigns are described in 2 Samuel 7:2-5 that tells of David's desire and 1 Kings 6 which documents Solomon's completion of Temple. Jesus builds a Temple, more lasting and more fruitful by giving His own Body to His People as food so that He could permanently 'dwell' within them. Jesus reveals this when he clears out the Physical Temple in Jerusalem in John 2:19, and announces, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." Jesus is not concerned with any material monument on the city square. No, Jesus is after a 'living memorial' or 'Temple of living stones' as 1 Peter 2:5 says it, "like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house...." Jesus wishes to build His 'sanctuary of presence' among the very people (Church) He calls to be His own. Jesus is talking about building a 'tabernacle' He would dwell in, that is the ongoing, continued lives of His faithful disciples. (Jesus further describes this 'real presence' of Himself, within the Temple-the Church, of His disciples in John 6:54 "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day." Jesus' Temple-Raising, or Temple building, is His people, His Church as they continue to live, serve and minister in His Name.

However, the crowds and people had different ideas about what type of king they wanted, and they wanted Jesus to fit into their expectations. Jesus knew their misunderstanding and always resisted the pressure from the crowd to make Him an 'earthly prince of power'. In John 6:15, we hear an example of Jesus' resistance to worldly power. John writes, "*Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.*" Also, as Jesus was on the way to the cross (His real Throne, and to wear His Crown-thorns), we hear the people ultimately reject His concept of power seen as humble service, when the chief priests announce, in John 19:15, "We have no king but Caesar." Also, the Jewish crowd quibbles over the inscription Pilate sarcastically put on Jesus' cross, "Do not write 'The King of the Jews,' but that he said, 'I am the King of the Jews.'" They are distancing themselves from Jesus' style of servant-leadership. Again, Jesus is king like no other!

If Jesus' leadership is not most clearly seen by His humble acceptance of suffering and death on the cross for His People, then the next best place to witness how Jesus expresses His kingly service is in His humble act of 'washing' (anointing) His apostles' feet at the Last Supper. I see this act of Jesus, as a type of anointing-coronation of them into his kingship of service. In John 13: 14, Jesus tells us that, *"If I,* therefore, the *master and teacher*, have *washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet."* Back in Matthew 20:25-26, Jesus had *called down* His apostles as they fell into the worldly temptation to 'boss and bully' others instead of 'sacrificing and serving' them, when Jesus said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and the great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you shall be your servant' That is Christ's Shepherd-King style of leadership! Peace, Fr Brian
