The sinkholes were repaired and backfilled, the wall was repaired with a new top cap and a second rail and new treads were installed for the stairs to the water. Riprap was installed along the entire sea wall to aid in reducing the damage caused by wake during peak boating months.

Off-Street Parking

The HOA restrictions do not permit parking for extended periods of time in the front lawn or off-street parking. Please note this restriction and make sure that vehicles are not parked off-street or in front lawns for extended periods of time.

Parking Pass Reminder

As a reminder, parking passes are required for parking at the Access Lot. This is to ensure we have a safe community for our members to enjoy. Please make sure to display your parking pass to avoid unnecessary towing as the towing company does not accept any excuses. Vehicles parked at the Access Lot that are not displaying the parking pass on their rearview mirror will be towed.

Cleaning Up After Your Dog

Unfortunately, this has become somewhat of an issue again. Please be courteous of your neighbors and pick up after your dog when your dog relieves itself on other people's property. Additionally, be sure to have your dog on a leash, as this is a town ordinance.

Fall Leaves

Let's face it, no one enjoys cleaning up the fall leaves that land in your yard or property; however, pushing them into the lake is not an option for clean up. Please put leaves in bags, garbage cans or in piles near the road. There is free pick up of yard waste, including leaves.

Bulk Trash Items

The Town of Cornelius does not pick up bulk trash items as stated on their website with a few exceptions. Bulk trash items are to be taken to a recycling facility with the closest one in Huntersville. Please do not place bulk trash items at the property edge. Neither the town nor the Bahia Bay HOA permits this.
