- President

Principal's Report

- Thank you to Erin O'Toole for organizing Oster's first Epic Games. Parent and students loved the new event.
- Thank you to Beth and Rebecca for another successful year of of Log-a-Mile. It empowers the kids and really does give back in a positive way.
- Ms. Guansing is moving out of the area will not be returning next year. It is a good move for her but a great loss for Oster.
- Noon duty and crossing guards are needed for next year.

- The pay has been raised from \$11/hour to \$15/hour.
- Noon duty hours are 11:45am-12:45pm. Working 4-5 days with a sub list is ideal.
- Recess 101
 - The staff would really like to move forward with this. The first payment is due in August.
 - The cost for this program would be \$25,500/year.
 - This year only, the District is allowing Oster to carry over \$20,000 in funding to next year (usually \$10,000). \$5,000 will come from the bond subsidy. Dianne would like to get approval. It was suggested that the new board review the budget before the motion is made and voted on.
 - The teaching staff would be willing to cut the field trip budget (This year it was \$15,000). If the line item is cut, parents would be asked to pay for field trips.
 - Dianne would be willing to cut intervention funding. Title I funding could be used instead.
 - There is a \$17,000 option. The program would only last until March.
- Sup. Horejs will be sending out a survey to this year's fourth grade families regarding Science Camp. Whatever decision will be made, will be a District decision. Hopefully the survey goes out before the end of the year. If an alternate site is chosen, there could be the same problems. As of now, Walden West is reserved for the week of May 17th.
