Army has won 4 of the last 5 meetings but prior to those, Navy had claimed a series record 14 straight wins in one of the greatest rivalries and traditions in all of college football. Navy has been favored in 17 of the last 19 meetings but find themselves around a TD underdog here. The Midshipmen should be used to that role this season as they've been an underdog in every game but one (Temple). After the disastrous start where Navy was out-scored 72-10 in their first two games, the Mids have "righted the ship" as they've covered 7 of their last 9 games. The offense is coming off their two best performances of the season vs East Carolina and Temple. On the other side, Army is having another solid season at 8-3. Their rush offense remains powerful averaging 301 ypg while they are only allowing 107 rush ypg on defense. It should be noted that Army has played a much easier schedule (No. 111 in our SOS rankings) while Navy played the toughest schedule out of any Group of 5 team (No. 49). Because of this and such a low total where points are going to be tough to come by, we are taking Navy +7.5 here. Totals' players note that the UNDER has cashed in 15 straight Army/Navy games by an average of 15 points per game. However, the market in our opinion has finally caught up to this UNDER trend as this year's total of 34 is the lowest total in the series in the last 19 years. It's also well UNDER the two teams' scoring averages for the season (Army games average 58 total ppg, Navy games average 50 total ppg).

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Thursday, December 9th

MINNESOTA 21 Pittsburgh 20. The Vikings defense seems like it is wearing down as they allowed 29 points to the lowly Lions last week. Makes sense considering they were missing a couple of key LB's. Minnesota has now lost 7 games this year by a combined 28 points. On the other side, the Steelers looked like they were "dead and buried" vs Cincinnati two weeks ago only to upset the Ravens last week. The Steelers are now 6-1-1 in one possession games this year. If the game is close, who do you trust? Lean Pittsburgh. Note Minnesota is on a 1-9 ATS run as a favorite.

Sunday, December 12th

KANSAS CITY 29 Las Vegas 19. Two teams heading in opposite directions. The Chiefs have now won 5 straight to take hold of the AFC West. Meanwhile the Raiders have now dropped 4 of their last 5 after losing on these pages to Washington last week. In those 4 losses, the Raiders offense has failed to top 16 points (Dallas performance on Thanksgiving the outlier). As Derek Carr goes, so do the Raiders as they are 0-6 when he fails to pass for 300 yards. KC beat LV 41-14 just a few weeks ago. It won't be that bad here but we think KC covers.

New Orleans 25 N.Y. JETS 19. The Saints have lost 5 in a row for the first time under Sean Payton. Taysom Hill wasn't the answer last week throwing 4 INT's (did run for more than 100 yards). Meanwhile, the Jets have not handled success well this year at 0-3 off a straight up win after losing to the Eagles last week. The Saints are expecting Alvin Kamara to return here. He's one of the most valuable non-QB's in the NFL. They also could see the return of other key players. Slight lean New Orleans.

San Francisco 25 CINCINNATI 23. Both teams coming off losses and both needing a win for playoff positioning. Cincinnati who has been healthy this season, could be down as many as 3 defensive starters and QB Joe Brady is dealing with a finger injury on his throwing hand. It's not like the 49ers were a beacon of health as they played without Deebo Samuel last week in the loss at Seattle. They certainly missed him in the second half. Lean Cincy.

TENNESSEE 24 Jacksonville 17. Jacksonville's offense is averaging just 10.7 ppg the last 6 games. It's a big reason why the UNDER is on a 7-0 run in their games. Tennessee is coming off a bye. Prior to it, the Titans looked like they were running on empty as they were crushed by the Patriots and lost outright to the Texans. They are not a team you want to lay points with especially without Derrick Henry. We lean on a team of NFL experts since we originate in CFB. They all attack the NFL markets in different ways and three of them like Jacksonville as a top play of the week. They have influenced the market with this line dropping from as high as Jacksonville +11 down to the current +8.5. We prefer the UNDER at the current numbers but still lean with Jacksonville.

CLEVELAND 20 Baltimore 19. These two just played on SNF two weeks ago (Baltimore won 16-10 as 3-point home favorites). Note Baltimore won that game two weeks despite Lamar Jackson's 4 interceptions. It was Cleveland's last game as the Browns come in off a bye. Meanwhile, Baltimore's 2-point attempt came up short in the final seconds vs Pittsburgh. We don't like the decision. When you're the superior team like Baltimore was, you want to play more to exert your dominance. Baltimore up to +8.5 is a good teaser option especially with a low total.

Atlanta 21 CAROLINA 20. The Panthers come in off a bye. They have lost 7 of their last 9 games after the 3-0 start. Cam Newton was just 5 of 21 vs Miami in his last start but it looks like he will get the start again here. We don't expect the offense to get better. The OC Brady was fired and RB McCaffrey's season is over. Meanwhile, the Falcons came up short on these pages last week losing to Tampa 30-17. They were covering the first 58 minutes until that

last Tampa FG (ugh!). We feel Atlanta up to +8.5 is another great teaser option with a low total. Points have more value.

Dallas 24 WASHINGTON 21. First of two match-ups between these two in a 3-week span. Washington has clearly turned their season around with 4 straight wins and 4 straight covers as they beat us on these pages last week with their 17-15 win over Las Vegas. If the season ended today, they would be the No. 6 seed in the NFC. Shocking considering how their season started. Meanwhile, Dallas has extra rest as they won in New Orleans last Thursday without head coach Mike McCarthy. He's expected back for this one. We lean with Washington here. Their defense is finally living up the preseason hype allowing just 17.4 ppg the last 5 games and it will be tough for Dallas to get margin.

Seattle 23 HOUSTON 16. The Texans are really bad. They have scored in the single-digits 6 times already this season after getting shutout last week and it looks like Davis Mills will get the start here. Meanwhile, Seattle got a nice upset over San Francisco last week. However, this is still a team that is only 3-8 in their last 11 games (outgained in all of them) and are No. 31 in the NFL in total defense. Does that sound like a team you want to lay more than a TD on the road with? We could only use Seattle in a teaser.

DENVER 25 Detroit 16. Congrats to the Lions who got their first win of the season last week with an 11-yard TD pass with :04 left. ATS wise they have been winning most of this season with an 8-4 ATS mark. How will they handle success here? Meanwhile, Denver had a 404-267 yard edge vs the Chiefs last week but a -2 TO deficit did them in. When Denver started the season 3-0, they beat 3 bottom teams all by 10-points or more. We look for more of the same here and lean with the Broncos. Really like them in a teaser down to -1.5.

L.A. CHARGERS 27 N.Y Giants 16. Jake Fromm will get the start here for the Giants. He was pulled from the Buffalo Bills practice squad last week as he was their 4th string QB. The Giants offense has managed just 10.7 ppg the last 3 games and it won't get any better here. Meanwhile, the Chargers got a nice win at Cincinnati last week to bolster their playoff hopes (currently the No. 5 seed). We don't expect to be involved in this one.

3★ OVER 53 TAMPA BAY 31 Buffalo 25. The Bills go from a cold, windy MNF loss to the Patriots (VIP's won with the UNDER) to 76 degrees and 6mph wind in Tampa Bay. That makes you want to take the OVER since their scoring was suppressed last week. In fact, the total scoring in a Buffalo game was also suppressed the week before against a New Orleans team that was decimated by injury on offense. Tampa has won their last 8 home games and have covered 7 of those. They beat us on these pages last week in their win and cover over the Falcons. We like Tampa and the OVER.

GREEN BAY 29 Chicago 16. The Packers are 5-0 SU and 5-0 ATS at home this season. They come in off a bye and are an NFL-Best 10-2 ATS this season. Meanwhile, the Bears are 2-0 vs Detroit this season and 2-8 vs everyone else. After Andy Dalton threw 4 INT's last week, it looks like they will go back to Justin Fields here. Obviously, Aaron Rodgers owns the Bears as the Packers have won 20 of the last 23 meetings. They make it 21 of 24 but we're not running to the window to lay 12.5.

Monday, December 13th

ARIZONA 27 L.A. Rams 24. One of the best games of the week is on MNF for the 2nd week in a row? Wow, that's a nice change for once. Reminds us when this seemed to be the case on a weekly basis back in its ABC days. Arizona is 4-0 SU and 4-0 ATS vs the NFC West this season including a 17-point win at the Rams. They got Kyler Murray back last week in the win over Chicago. That's now 8 games with 30 or more points this season for Arizona. Meanwhile the Rams cruised over Jacksonville. The Cardinals can almost lock up the division with a win here (up 3 with 4 to go). As of now, we don't see much value.
