## DON'T MESS WITH TEXAS

The Texas Longhorns are 2-4 after beating Oklahoma this past Saturday in Dallas. After just 1½ years at the helm in Austin, Charlie Strong's over record is 8-11. 421 and he is just 6-6 vs Big 12 opponents. Prior to accepting the Texas head coaching job, Charlie Strong had gone 37-15.712 from 2010 to 2013 at Louisville. Before the win over Oklahoma there had been talk that Texas might reconsider the decision to hire Strong as their head coach. Texas recently accepted the resignation of AD Steve Patterson and it's possible that the new Texas AD would rather have "his" man to lead this program as opposed to inheriting Strong. The fact that so many of Texas' rivals are winning, makes this even tougher for Longhorn fans. TCU, Baylor, Oklahoma, Texas A&M and Houston are all very successful right now and they all field fast / up-tempo style offenses that recruits like. What is the future of Charlie Strong at Texas? We're not sure, but we believe that he deserves, at the very least, a minimum of 3 years to show that he is the right man for the Texas job or that he isn't the right man for the job. A popular slogan that has been around for many years is "Don't Mess with Texas". We believe that could apply to the head coaching job at the University of Texas. At least, not yet.

This past weekend TCU, Michigan State, Florida State and Oklahoma State all came through in close games to keep their undefeated seasons alive. The Horned Frogs over came an 18 point deficit to beat Kansas State 52-45. Michigan State scored a TD with less than a minute left, to escape Rutgers 31-24. Florida State blew a 14 point lead and found themselves down 24-23 to Miami in the 4th quarter but the Seminoles found a way to get by the Hurricanes 29-24. Oklahoma State allowed West Virginia to tie their game late in the 4th quarter but the Cowboys prevailed in overtime 33-26.

This past Thursday, Washington went to Los Angeles and upset the Trojans 17-12 to get the weekend off to a wild start. Last Saturday, in Knoxville, Georgia's Nick Chubb was injured in the 1st quarter and the Vols over came a 21 point deficit to beat the Bulldogs 38-31. Nebraska might be have the worst luck of any team in college football. This past Saturday the Huskers lost another game that they could have won. When Wisconsin beat Nebraska on a field goal with 4 seconds left on the clock, it represented the 4th time this season that Nebraska had lost a game on their opponents final offensive play. LSU hosted South Carolina at Tiger Stadium as opposed to traveling to Williams-Brice Stadium due to flooding in Columbia. The Bengal Tigers improved to 5-0 with a 45-24 win. In Salt Lake City, Jared Goff threw 5 interceptions as Cal lost their first game of the season and Utah improved to 5-0 with a 30-24 win for the Utes.

## AROUND THE NATION

On Thursday night UCLA (4-1) will travel up to Palo Alto to take on the powerful Stanford Cardinal (4-1). The winner takes a huge step forward in the Pac-12 while the loser will rely on pride to carry them the rest of the season. Boston College (3-3) will travel down to Clemson (5-0). There was no hangover after beating Notre Dame because the Tigers looked great in beating Georgia Tech. Iowa (6-0) goes to Northwestern (5-1). The Hawkeyes are improving every week as they march towards a Big Ten West Division title. Michigan State (6-0) goes to Michigan (5-1). The Wolverines have posted 3 consecutive shutouts while Michigan State has struggled the past two weeks vs Purdue and Rutgers. Penn State (5-1) at Ohio State (6-0). Last week Urban Meyer had Cardale Jones as the starting QB but JT Barrett came in when OSU got into the red zone and it worked to perfection as the Buckeyes rolled past Maryland. Alabama (5-1) goes to Kyle Field to face Texas A&M (5-0). The Crimson Tide has really looked good on defense since their loss to Ole Miss but they'll be tested against the high scoring Aggies. USC (3-2) goes to Notre Dame (5-1) in one of the greatest intersectional rivalry in sports. The Trojans will try to rebound after losing to Washington while Notre Dame still has dreams of ending up in the CFB Playoffs. Arizona State (4-2) goes to Salt Lake City to take on the undefeated Utah Utes (5-0). ASU is coming off two consecutive wins while Utah just got by a tough California teams last Saturday. West Virginia (3-2) goes to Baylor (5-0). The Bears are the highest scoring team in college football so the pressure will be on the Mountaineers defense. Oklahoma (4-1) is at Kansas State (3-2). Both the Sooners and Wildcats are smarting after suffering heartbreaking losses this past Saturday

At Florida, Jim McElwain has taken the same players that were mediocre with Will Muschamp as their head coach and instilled a new confidence in them and the results have been amazing. QB Will Grier has done a good job as the leader on offense but it's the defense that is key for Florida. If they play like they did vs Ole Miss or Missouri, Florida can beat any team in the SEC but they come out flat like they did vs Tennessee, the Gators are vulnerable and can lose.

LSU, offensively, has pretty much been the Leonard Fournette show in 2015. Many people are comparing Fournette to former great SEC running backs, Herschel Walker, and Bo Jackson. That is pretty high praise to be mentioned with those two. He has been extremely reliable this season but it remains to be seen if LSU QB Brandon Harris is capable of carrying this team if the situation ever demands it.

Florida leads the all-time series vs LSU 31-27-3. Florida also leads 16-15 all-time in games played in Baton Rouge. LSU has won 4 of the last 5 games vs Florida and Les Miles is 6-4 vs Florida since he became the head coach of the Bayou Bengal Tigers. We're predicting LSU to come away with the victory at Tiger Stadium vs Florida.

# **FBS STADIUM SEATING CAPACI**

Below we list all of the stadiums, in order of seating capacity, that the current 128 NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision schools call home in 2015. You will notice that there are 129 stadiums listed because the University of Arkansas actually lists two stadiums as their home stadium. The Razorbacks play a majority of their home games on campus in Fayetteville, AR at Razorback Stadium but they also play a game or 2 at War Memorial Stadium in Little Rock, AR every season. The Georgia State Panthers plays at the 71,228 seat Georgia Dome but when the Panthers play their home games there, the official capacity is 28,155 because they only use the lower bowl of the Georgia Dome.

Kenan Memorial Stadium was named for 1894 UNC graduate William R Kenan Jr. It opened in 1927 with 24,000 permanent seats and with the exception of when temporary seats were added for the "bigger" games, capacity stayed at that number until 1963 when upper decks were added along with permanent seats in the endzones upping the capacity to 48,000. Between 1996

> and 1998 another 8,000 seats were added to the west endzone and made Kenan Stadium a true horseshoe shaped stadium.

> In 2011 the east endzone of Kenan Stadium was completed and transformed Kenan Stadium from a horseshoe into a bowl. Those east endzone seats included

the Loudermilk Center for Student Excellence structure. The current seating capacity of Kenan Stadium is 63,000 and there is not a better setting for football in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

There has always been an unwritten rule that the stadium can never be taller than the surrounding pine trees and thus far that rule has been kept. The stadium fits in beautifully with the surrounding campus and it maintains superior sight lines to view a game.

North Carolina has always been known as a basketball school but football is very important to the school and Kenan Stadium proves that by how much money has been poured into the facility. In our opinion, North Carolina is a sleeping giant as far as football goes. If they ever get a superior head coach and can keep him on campus, the future could be very bright at UNC. Imagine if Mack Brown had stayed at North Carolina and not taken the Texas job in 1998. It's possible that he could have taken North Carolina football to an elite level but that's all speculative.

There has been talk of possibly expanding Kenan Stadium further but for now it's just been talk and there are no definitive plans for that at this time. The only thing that has been discussed is the possibility of installing new and larger high definition replay scoreboards in each endzone. That seems to be a trend that has taken college football, the NFL and Major League Baseball by storm. It's not a question of if, but when that will happen.

Steve Spurrier is the "Head Ball Coach". He is probably more responsible for opening up the offenses in the once traditional grind-it-out SEC than anyone. Most pundits claimed that you could not rely on the passing game in the Southeastern Conference and be successful, but Spurrier's Florida Gator squads were ultra successful in the '90's.

After his Gators were taken behind the woodshed by Tommie Frazier and Nebraska following the 1995 season, Spurrier's team was ready to take that next step and that was to finish the season as the National Champions. Leaning heavily on Heisman trophy winner, Danny Wuerffell, the Gators hit their stride at precisely the right time which ultimately cumulated into a National Championship. After Ohio State had defeated Arizona State in the Rose Bowl earlier in the day, Spurrier knew that a victory of arch rival Florida State in the Sugar Bowl would allow his squad to win the school's first ever National Championship in football. A convincing 52-20 win followed and Spurrier had his first and only National Championship as a head coach.

He stayed in Gainesville for 5 more season but the lure of the NFL was too much to ignore and in 2002 he became the head coach of the Washington Redskins. His stay in Washington lasted just two seasons and after sitting out the 2004 season, he became the head coach at the University of South Carolina, an SEC program that had never played in the SEC Championship Game since they joined the Southeastern Conference in 1992. That fact

changed in 2010 when his Gamecocks won the SEC Eastern Division. Even though they lost the SEC Championship Game to Auburn in 2010, the South Carolina program had finally arrived. In 2011, 2012 and 2013 with the help of All-American DE Jadeveon Clowney, Spurrier's squads were 11-2 in each of those seasons. Now in his 11th season in Columbia, Steve Spurrier is the winningest coach in the history of both Florida and South Carolina.
