PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I'm writing this the day after our CD3 North District meeting here in Grand Junction. We were so happy to have ladies from Montrose and Craig join us, as well as guests from here in Grand Junction that were new to the organization. What an honor to have our State President, Marilyn Harris from Pagosa Springs join us! She emphasized the critical importance of this upcoming election. Our theme for the day was "Republican Women Love and Support Children". Melissa Lytle Executive Director of the Western Slope Center for Children brought us up to date on the new facility and the work they are doing for the abused children on the Western slope. Also speaking to us was Laura Carno, author and now current Director of FASTER, an organization founded to help schools learn to safely put guns in the hands of school officials to provide protection for the students.

County Commissioner Rose Pugliese introduced the "Women for Walker" campaign and explained how very important it is for women to get behind the Stapleton for Governor's campaign. It seems there are some women who are "offended" that Walker supports President Trump's policies as they aren't pleased with the way the President "Tweets." This is an insane way to look at the consequences of this election. Rose, with the support of Mrs. Stapleton and several women on the Front Range, began the "Women for Walker" campaign, with the statewide kickoff yesterday. It cannot be stressed enough how important it is for Walker to defeat his opponent. The difference between them politically is night and day. Walker is conservative and practical; he understands what makes this state work and has the interest of the rural areas at heart. His opponent has very socialist views. However, if one were to read the op-ed in today's local newspaper, one would assume he has the best interests of the Western Slope at heart. He is known to oppose everything oil and gas related, has very little, if any, knowledge of the Jordan Cove Project and would support much larger setbacks for drilling. It would be wise to look beyond what he says into what he has voted for or voted against, for that matter, in Congress. If Colorado is to have the opportunity to grow and prosper, it is crucial that Walker Stapleton is our next Governor.

We say this every election, but THIS ELECTION IS THE MOST IMPORTANT IN MY LIFETIME! And I've lived through a lot of elections. On the national front, Scott Tipton will be facing a well organized and well financed opponent for CD 3. Closer to home we can look at the race for Governor where there is a tremendous gap between the political philosophies of the two candidates. Our two State Representatives have tough races with opposing candidates. In HD 54, Matt Soper has two opponents, one a democrat and one an independent. Both seem to have good support. In HD 55 Janice Rich has an opponent who will be running an aggressive campaign as well. Ray Scott has a current City Councilor as an opponent. There is not one of these races that we can take for granted.

So – where do we start? There are many ways we can help – the Victory office is open at 2484 Commerce Blvd. and volunteers will be needed to help staff the office. One thing we can all do is use every opportunity to let friends know who we are supporting and why. As much as is possible, the campaigns all need funds for their advertising. Letters to the Editor in support of all our candidates are so important. If you need suggestions as to content of your letter, the candidates will be happy to give you some suggestions. You could hold a neighborhood coffee for a candidate. This is a fun way to get together with your neighbors and give them an opportunity to spend personal time with a candidate. You may have neighbors who are "on the fence" and just need to know the candidate! Let us know what you would like to do – anything to further the cause is welcome!

ON MAY 26, 1924 PRESIDENT CALVIN COOLEGGE SIGNED THE IMMIGRATION ACT OF 1924. THE MOST STRINGENT US IMMIGRATION POLICY UP TO THAT TIME IN THE NATION'S HISTORY!

“It is my belief that those who live here and really want to help some other country, can best accomplish that result by making themselves truly and wholly American. I mean by that, giving their first allegiance to this country and always directing their actions in a course which will be first of all for the best interests of this country. They cannot help other nations by bringing old world race prejudices and race hatreds into action here. In fact, they can best help other countries by scrupulously avoiding any such motives. It can be taken for granted that we all wish to help Europe. We cannot secure that result by proposing or taking any action that would injure America. ... We can be in a position to help only by unifying the American nation, building it up, making it strong, keeping it independent, using its inclination to help and its disinclination to injure.”
