SECOND ANNUAL TUCKER Fourth of July FIREWORKS

For the second year in a row, the City of Tucker will be celebrating America's birthday in style with a patriotic bash on its iconic Main Street.

The July 3 Celebration of Independence and Fireworks Spectacular is back after drawing an estimated 5,000 revelers last year. The 2019 edition will again feature live music and entertain-



ment, but with expanded food options. The fireworks display will be professionally managed by East Coast Pyrotechnics from behind Tucker High School. Seating for the event will be along Main Street facing Tucker High School. Bring your blankets or beach chairs!

"Last year's Spectacular was a huge success, but we knew there were some areas where we could improve," says Tucker's City-Community Connector Sonja Szubski. "Specifically, our amazing downtown restaurants were overwhelmed by the crowd last year. This time, we're bringing in some of Metro Atlanta's most popular food trucks to help accommodate all those hungry patriots. So, you can pack a picnic, dine in our restaurants or enjoy the food trucks; either way, there will be significantly less of a wait for food."

Music for this year's Spectacular will be provided by local band 16 Penny. The Buford-based group is

billed as "a fun, party style dance rock band playing all of your favorite tunes from the 60s, 70s, 80s and 90s with a little today rock sprinkled in."

This is the second event of the TKR Summer of Fun series. The complete summer series is sponsored by Old Town Tucker Merchants Association (OTTMA), Jacobs Engineering and Discover DeKalb. Hall of Fame-level sponsors are the Tucker-Northlake CID, Tucker Summit CID and Optech.

City of Tucker Millage Rate Yields Property Tax Reduction

At its meeting on June 26, Tucker's Mayor and City Council voted to approve the City's first millage rate. While some may be quick to call out a tax increase in the fiscally responsible new City, the reality is property owners are going to see their tax rate go down.

"We are taking over taxing authority for the parks from DeKalb County and we're doing it for less than DeKalb County was charging." Mayor Frank Auman explained.

What is Patriotism? Joel Gilbert

Sometimes a word replaces a thought for so long that it causes us to forget its true meaning. Patriotism may just be one of those words. The meaning is very simple: love for your country. Yet, today, the meaning seems to have shifted slightly toward meaning your beliefs are something you stick with... almost like loyalty or perseverance. As we celebrate this holiday with friends and family, check the word 'Patriotism' out. How does it compare with a word like 'Nationalism'? If you look at your favorite source for insights into the word Nationalism, you find it's meaning is a bit more political or potentially divisive. You see something other than love for sure. Maybe we need to simply go back to the basics... a love of country. Perhaps that is the real problem. True love is not selfish. True love shows devotion and service without expectation of a 50/50 balance or without knowing "what's in it for me?"

Tucker's millage rate will be 0.9 mils, with that money going to fund Parks and Recreation in the City. For 2019, DeKalb County will be taxing at a rate of 1.458 mils. That figure will now go to ZERO on tax bills for Tucker citizens as Tucker takes over responsibility for Parks and Recreation.

"It's a big step for us in the development of the City," Auman said. "Up to now, the City's had no property tax and no ad valorem tax. That was true and that was part of the plan. This step takes us into a place where we're collecting our own taxes to, in this case, fund our park operations, while relieving our residents of that portion of their DeKalb County tax bill."

Since assuming responsibility for its parks from DeKalb County in 2018, Tucker's Parks and Recreation Department has been quick to repair and upgrade parks amenities that needed attention. This is evident in new playgrounds at Henderson, Kelley Cofer and Montreal Parks, as well as at the Tucker Recreation Center. They have also worked to make significant cosmetic and infrastructure improvements to the aging Rec Center, including new HVAC units, fresh coats of paint and security cameras. Kelley Cofer pool has seen upgrades, including a new splash pad installed this year through a partnership with DeKalb County.

In the coming months, more improvements are on the way including lights on the tennis courts at Henderson Park, repair of and expansion of the dock at Lake Erin, renovating the kitchen and bathrooms at the Rec Center, replacing aging fences in virtually all the parks, and installing parking spaces at Smoke Rise Park. If you enable notifications, a message will pop up in your email queue or on your cell phone queue. Or, you can disable notifications and just log on to Nextdoor when you like.



City of Tucker Code Enforcement

Code Enforcement was one of the three areas that the City of Tucker became responsible for when it became a city in March of 2016. Smoke Rise, at that time, became part of the City of Tucker, and is in District 1. The other areas we are now responsible for are planning & zoning and parks & recreation.

Code Enforcement for Tucker is headed up by Maricela Perdomo, who has been it's manager since November, 2017. In addition, there are two additional code officers.

The City of Tucker Code Enforcement's mission is to educate the public and enforce the City of Tucker's code ordinances. They protect and enhance property values, maintain community appearance and standards, and to preserve the quality and beautification of our community through the enforcement of city codes and ordinances.

Below are the requirements of some common residential codes that affect our properties in Smoke Rise:

- (1) Grass and Weeds: must be maintained below 12 inches in height.
- (2) Accessory Structures: All accessory structures, including detached garages, fences and walls shall be maintained to be structurally sound and in good repair.
- (3) Motor Vehicles: No inoperative or unlicensed motor vehicles shall be parked, kept, or stored on any premises, and no vehicle shall at any time be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in the process of being stripped or dismantled.
- (4) Parking: All vehicles shall be parked on a paved surface that is connected to and has continuous paved access to a public or private street.

(5) Signs: The below types of signs are not allowed:

- Signs on the dedicated right-of-way of any public road, other than publicly owned or maintained signs and signs pertaining to railroad crossings. Note: a good rule-of-thumb for the right-of-way is to identify the area between the edge of the street and utility poles.
- Signs erected by nailing, fastening, or affixing the sign in any manner to any tree, curb, utility pole, or natural feature.
- Signs attached to any vehicle, located in view of the street right-of-way.

Note: There are some exceptions, such as temporary signs requiring a sign permit, temporary special event signs, etc.

Reporting what you observe as code violations to the code enforcement is easy.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, along with World Health Organization (WHO), the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the Bill & Melinda

Gates Foundation, Rotary has helped to reduce polio cases by more than 99.9 percent. While polio now is endemic in only three countries (Afghanistan, Nigeria, and Pakistan), new cases shed light on the importance of vaccinating every last child. While polio is a threat to a child anywhere, it remains a threat to a child everywhere.





Are Immunizations Really Controversial?? -- An Opinion

It is interesting for me to watch the anti-vaccination cycle come and go again. I have lived through at least two cycles now. In fact, in 1986 I wrote a two-part journal article about the famous British anti-vaccination experience. Immunizations have not been around forever, of course. On the other hand, childhood diseases like polio, measles, mumps, rubella, diptheria and meningitis have.

For those of you who know who Dr. Denmark was, you might find this interesting. Dr. Denmark was a female pediatrician that lived to be 114 years old. She practiced out of a little office in her house in Alpharetta/ Cumming until she was 103. She had one daughter of her own. Dr. Denmark was credited with being a codeveloper of the whooping cough (Pertussis) vaccine.

When my children were babies, I took my infant son to see her for a well child check. She was in her late 90s then. I drove all the way to Alpharetta to her little farmhouse just to meet her. She was one of a kind. Not many women went to medical school in those days, and I just couldn't let the opportunity to meet her pass. She was the only woman in the Medical College of Georgia (class of 1928). She was the third woman to ever graduate from medical school in the entire state of Georgia.

Leila Denmark entered the practice of medicine before antibiotics, immunizations and baby food. In fact, I asked her what three things she thought had changed the practice of medicine the most during her 70 something years of practice. Her answer? "Antibiotics, immunizations and baby food." She lived through the years of children dying of infectious diseases like staph pneumonia, rheumatic fever and polio. She saw chicken pox, measles, mumps and rubella. She heard the terrible 'whoop' of whooping cough and saw the deadly gray membrane of diptheria closing off the throats of sweet little children. Today

we have to 'google' a video to hear what whooping cough sounds like and look on the internet to see what measles looks like. Many pediatricians and family doctors have never seen these diseases. Why not? Because of antibiotics and immunizations!

It is easy to sit in an armchair in our 'safe' America and think none of these diseases will ever come back to affect us. There are several reasons that this is not true.

1) We live in a global society. Yes, the World Health Organization is 'close' to eradicating polio from the face of the earth. BUT. There are still native strains that appear in countries across the globe today ... Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria to name three. The 33 cases reported in 2018 could become a new wave epidemic, especially if immunization rates decrease. A trip to one of these countries, or a traveler with the disease could be the start of an outbreak.

I went to Nigeria in 1990. I saw measles in children there.

Measles is a highly contagious, airborne disease. As you know, there are currently outbreaks in Israel, Russia and New York, California and 26 other states. There have been over 1000 cases in the U.S. during the first 6 months of 2019. The U.S. has now lost its designation as a measles-free country.

2) This is not the first 'antivaccination' cycle. There have been several 'cycles' where parents have resisted giving their children immunizations. In the 1975-1983 British society, they worried about neurologic damage from the pertussis vaccine. This resulted in a terrible outbreak of Pertussis (whooping cough). Interestingly, the current 'cycle' of anti-vaccination has caused an outbreak in the U.S. of whooping cough. The worst recent year was 2012... with over 48,000 cases! This respiratory disease can be deadly-especially in infants because they have such small airways.

Today's modern 'cycle' of non-immunizing parents is mainly due to the fears provoked by a fraudulent doctor who popularized the idea that autism is caused by childhood vaccinations. In fact, this British doctor lost his license to practice medicine because he was found to fake data on ALMOST EVERY PATIENT in his paper. He still lectures. And people still believe him. Since 2003, a total of nine studies have proven that autism is not caused by vaccines or any mercury (thimersol) component in them. Thimersol was removed from childhood immunizations between 1999 and 2001. Autism rates continue to rise. Shouldn't rates decrease if Thimersol is the cause?? Yes.

3) Herd immunity (sometimes called 'community immunity') varies depending on which disease you are referring to. Herd immunity is a concept that means those who cannot be immunized can be protected from the disease if a certain percentage of the 'herd' or whole population is immunized. The immunization of the 'herd' will prevent the vulnerable from getting the disease. Examples of those who are vulnerable include: babies too young to receive vaccines, those who are on chemotherapy or otherwise immunosuppressed and the very elderly.

Exceptionally contagious diseases like measles require 95% of the population to be immunized to prevent the disease in the vulnerable. Less contagious diseases may only require 80-85% of the populations to be immunized. Currently, there is an overall immunization rate in the U.S. of 85%. What do you suppose might happen if immunization rates fall further? Think about it.

Being Counted, Counts!

As we celebrate America's independence this month, it's worth noting; the next United States Census will be held on April 1, 2020. The decennial census was first taken in 1790, as mandated by the Constitution. The results provide a tally of our population and households. The data serve as the basis for reapportioning congressional seats, redistricting, and distributing more than \$675 billion in federal funds annually to support states, counties and communities' vital programs (in the areas of education, healthcare, transportation, housing, recreation and other public needs).

United States®

Census

The census aims to count every person living in the United States: in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the island areas. This includes people of all ages, races, ethnic groups, citizens and non-citizens too.

In 2015, an independent study was conducted by George Washington University identifying that each resident of Georgia is allotted \$1,339 per year for services.

It estimated that, with a 100 percent response rate to the 2020 Census, DeKalb County could receive \$985 million per year during the next 10 years. In the last census count in 2010, DeKalb County had a reported 72 percent response rate. That means the county failed to benefit from \$275 million worth of funding. To help raise awareness about the 2020 Census, the governing authority of DeKalb County has created a "Compete Count Committee." You should hear more about this from our representatives in the coming months.

By April 2020, you should have received a census form to fill out. You will have three options to respond: online, by phone, or by mail. Census workers (carrying a census badge and bag) will also visit households that do not return questionnaires. The 2020 Census questionnaire will consist of eight questions, asking for basic information about the people in your household, and should take about 10 minutes to complete. The Census Bureau will never ask for: Social Security numbers, money, donations, anything on behalf of a political party, or bank or credit card account numbers.

In case you were wondering; strict federal laws protect the confidentiality of respondents and the personal information they provide. The Census Bureau cannot share an individual's census questionnaire responses with anyone, including other federal agencies and law enforcement entities. Also, all Census Bureau employees take a lifetime oath to protect confidentiality and are subject to a jail term, a hefty fine — or both — for disclosing any information that could identify a respondent or household.

Democracy works best when everyone is counted. The 2020 Census is important for DeKalb's (and our nation's) future, and *your response is required by law.* For more information, visit the Census Bureau online at www.2020census.gov.



The tradition of the markers was begun in 1945 with the National Council of State Garden Clubs, now known as National Garden Club. The program was adopted in New Jersey and The Blue Star Highway System was also established at that time. Today the markers are in all 50 states and are located in gardens, in front of city halls, Veteran's facilities, government offices and interstate highway rest areas and welcome centers.

The Blue Star Markers are a powerful reminder that "Freedom Is Not Free."



DeKalb Federation of Garden Clubs began "The Legends Club" to recognize long term, dedicated members of our clubs in 2017. The Garden Center at Callanwolde sponsors a planting in their honor each year and a permanent plaque is kept in the Garden Center. I'd Rather Have a Loaf of Bread by Bob Newman

I began making bread about 25 years ago. Early on, I gave my barber a loaf of bread in place of a tip. One day, I went for a haircut but hadn't had time to bake a loaf so I tried to give him a money tip; he refused and said, "I'd rather have a loaf of bread."

Over the years, I have tried various recipes offered in books, and tried different ways of measuring ingredients, to the extent I even considered buying a digital scale attempting to be exact. But making bread should be simple and fun, so I have simplified my technique to where I use a one-cup liquid measure, a half-cup dry measure, and a tablespoon, which allows me to make a loaf that will last my wife and me for two days with about one-hour of hands-on labor and several hours of waiting. That means two loaves a week, three on haircut week. Here is my simple technique:

Ingredients:

- · Five half-cups of bread flour
- (I prefer King Arthur or Bob's Red Mill)
- · One tablespoon of sea salt
- · One tablespoon of Active Dry yeast
- · One cup of warm water.

Procedure:

- · Add salt to the flour in the bowl and stir.
- · Add yeast to the bowl and stir.
- Add water to the mixture and begin mixing (I use my Kitchen Aid).
- Increase the speed and mix for 10 minutes.
- If the dough is sticking to the bowl, add a tablespoon of flour; if it feels too dry to the touch, add a tablespoon of water.
- Cover the bowl with a damp cloth and let it rise for about two hours; it should have doubled in size.
- Shape the dough into a ball with your hands, making sure to get a smooth surface top and bottom.
- Place the shaped dough on parchment paper, sprinkle some flour on top, cover it with the damp towel, and set the oven to 400°F.
- When the oven reaches temperature, the dough will have risen again, and will be ready to transfer to the oven on a cookie sheet or a pizza stone. Make two cuts in the top with a very sharp knife and set the timer to 30 minutes.
- Remove the finished loaf from the oven and let it cool on a wire rack for another 30 minutes before enjoying the fruit of your labor.
- Take a deep breath and inhale the fragrance of fresh baking.

The best way to enjoy the bread is to slather it with salted Irish butter while it is still warm and the crust is
