

Pastor's Study **Desk Notes**



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

22nd Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

Matthew 16:21-27

The rise and fall of Peter! And Peter had done so well last week in the gospel when he recognized and called Jesus the 'Messiah, son of the living God' (Mt 16:16), in front of the other apostles. Jesus complimented Peter and even assigned him a position as the leading apostle for such insightful perception. Jesus' statement plays on Peter's name, basically saying "You Rock!" and you Peter will be the firm foundational figure of leadership for my church and disciples after me. But what happened to precipitate Peter's crumbling in today's gospel. Is it a classic proof example of 'the higher they rise, the harder they fall? We see such tragic, overnight transformations of leaders from 'Hero to Zero' all the time in the news. What causes such crashes? Proverbs 16:18 teaches, "Pride goes before disaster, and a haughty spirit before a fall." Jesus Himself will say, "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted" (Matthew 23:12) Peter typifies such haughty over-reach and its subsequent fall. Skiers talk about the danger of 'letting one's head get over the tip of their skis', which leads to a topple! Or the classic way of saying it, is that 'our mouths write a check that our bodies cannot cash'! Well, Peter does exactly that, when he presumes to tell Jesus HOW and what kind of Messiah Jesus should be! Peter says in Matthew 16:22 "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you" right after Jesus mentioned the necessary suffering that will come through His rejection, His cross and death. Peter wants to redefine the Father's will for Jesus, and sugarcoat over the sacrifice part of discipleship (taking the cross out of Christianity). How presumptuous! Of course, we can ask how that works out for Peter? He gets puts back in his place! Jesus responds by taking Peter down a few notches, saying, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me" (Matt 16:23) Peter was trying to outflank Jesus and trying to get around the hard-side of being a disciple-the cross. So, Jesus says, "Stop opposing me, & get back in line – get back behind me (follow me)".

Yet, before we jump into the mob chorus and condemn Peter for such presumptuous behavior, I want to point out that Peter is not the only Christian leader, who forgets who he is serving, or who tries to create his own selfish version of being disciple. James and John will try such an arrogant move themselves. We hear in Mark 10:35, James and John actually ask Jesus, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you" (Not asking for much are they?) They go on to ask Jesus boldly, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left" (Mk 10:37) How conceited of them! As if it couldn't get any worse, right after James and John's pompous power grab, we hear in Mark 10:41, that "When the ten heard this, they all became indignant at James and John". It seems that all of the apostles were infected with this 'egotistical' bug, wanting to boss others around, even 'bossing' Jesus!

Of course, Jesus will put all of the apostles (not just Peter) into their place, reminding them that they are 'disciples'. They are 'student servants' of Him. Jesus strongly asserts that His disciples do not idolize power, 'boss' people around or serve their own selfish interests. No, Christian disciples embrace the cross and love to serve others, always putting others begore their own needs. For Jesus' followers, 'authority is service'. A Christian leads others to the degree, that he/she is actually serving others themselves. In Mark 10:43-44, Jesus reprimands them all saying, "Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant, & whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all."

So, what are we to make of such 'rise and falls' of our leaders? Well, it happens. Anytime a human ego is not bounded by either one's own honest humility (There but for the grace of God go I) or by the proper loving guardrails known as the 'best practices of checks and balances', then count on it that the human ego will overreach and abusively exert itself over others (absolute authority, corrupts absolutely). This is why Jesus is so adamant about the Christian leader being a humble servant. Among Jesus' followers, the Blessed Mother exemplifies this humble attitude of a Christian leader best. She herself prays in Luke 1:38, "I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." And Mary's selfless counsel to the other apostles is her simple teaching, "Do whatever he (Jesus) tells you" (John 2:5) Now, that is Christian service and such guiding wisdom will keep a person behind Jesus and in line with Him! May we follow Jesus as faithfully as her, and lead others as she did! Peace and Prayers, Fr Brian
