The Outreach Program at Sierra Vista United Methodist Church is a multi-faceted program designed to extend "love for our neighbors" to all in the community around us.

Some of the programs covered under Outreach include:

- Food Pantry Bags of food are available for all who come in to request it.
- A Clothing and Toiletry Closet provides clothes and self-care items to children and adults.
- The Community Assistance Fund financially assists those needing help to pay their rent or utility bills.
- Along with the Borderlands Food Bank, we sponsor Produce on Wheels With Out Waste (POWWOW) once a month. At POWWOW, guests can purchase up to 70 pounds of produce for \$12. Special arrangements apply for those in need.
- Members help with cooking at the Good Neighbor Alliance shelter.
- Classes are available to the community in Citizenship and English as a Second Language.
- School Supplies are given to local schools to assist students who need them.
- Vacation Bible School is available to the community as well as to our church at no charge.
- A Crockpot Seminar is held in the fall each year. Mothers are given a Crockpot and recipes are demonstrated to encourage family meals.
- An Appreciation Potluck is held for the children and parents of Village Christian Preschool that operates as a ministry of our church.
- Outreach members work with other community agencies such as Salvation Army and St. Vincent de Paul
- Financially, Sierra Vista UMC Outreach assists other United Methodist Churches, such as Huachuca City UMC and Bis bee First UMC.
