PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR CATHIE

When Paul wrote to the

early church in the places he had been and expected to be, he always wrote a salutation followed by a thanksgiving. Since I am now writing you letters each month, it seems appropriate to adopt Paul's style for my letters to you. This month's greeting follows the particular style of Romans, my favorite of Paul's letters.

To all of God's beloved in Community Presbyterian Church, who are called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I thank God through Jesus Christ for all of you. You are willing to live your faith, and to seek opportunities to grow in your faith. You have been incredibly welcoming to both Paul Campbell, and to me. I have appreci-

ated those of you who have stopped by to visit with me, sometimes on a particular issue, and sometimes just to chat and get to know one another.

We have already worked through some "change and transition" issues (and there will be more), which was to be ex-

pected after your own experiences and now as you learn to walk with me, and as I am learning to walk with you. Through the various situations, I am filled with gratitude that we are able to pray about our lives together, seeking solutions that honor God and one another.

We had the privilege of baptizing Ava Michelle on May 15th. It truly takes a community to raise a child, and

that is what you promised to be for Ava, and all those who are baptized in Christ, now and in the future.

I would like you to think about what you promised. Here are the words we ask of the congregation each time we baptize another child of God.

"Do you, as members of the church of Jesus Christ, promise to guide and nurture this child, by word and deed, with love and prayer, encouraging them to know and follow Christ and to be a faithful member of their church?" You answered: "We do."

As a community of Christ, you answer "we do" because the responsibility lies on each of us, not just a few people. Being a community of Christ means we work together, pray together, and come together to demonstrate our love and commitment to God through not only what we say and pray, but more importantly, what we do – it is our actions that speak louder than any of our words.

This month I ask you to ponder on your own words and actions. We promised that we would "guide and nurture" each

child of God. What does that mean to you? What would you expect others to do to meet the promise of "guiding and nurturing" members of the church, young and not so young folks? And the next question is...are you using your talents, gifts, and resources to "guide and nurture" the children of God here at Community Presbyterian Church?

My questions are not meant to be a judgement, just an opportunity for each of us to take the time to reflect and ponder on what it is that we promised. It is an opportunity to look at what we are doing, and what we could be doing to assure our promise is kept to each and every one of God's children within our community, and outside within the broader community.

Other things we promised that you can ask the same questions for: "with love and prayer;" "encouraging them to know and follow Christ;" and "to be a faithful member of their church."

We have programs that will need workers and children of God to attend. Vacation Bible School is right around the corner, June 13-16. Are your children signed up? How about your nieces, nephews, grandchildren, or kids from the neighborhood? Encourage them to attend. If you can, come be a volunteer or provide a ride. If you are unable to be part of VBS, please take time to pray for the children, the teachers, and the others working to make VBS be a place the children see God in all who are there so they may follow Christ, and be a faithful member of their church now and in the future.

We have youth activities this summer which need your guidance and nurturing; your encouraging, love, and prayer. Our "Young at Heart" folks who are playing ball would love to have you at the games, encouraging them as they build a fellowship out in the community.

Next Fall we will start Sunday School again – for all of God's children. There will be opportunities to be encouraging and supportive. We need teachers and people to attend, people who are willing to demonstrate through their Christian leadership and actions just what it means to follow Christ and be a faithful member of the church.

Don't forget worship...it takes a community to have worship. We need liturgists, ushers, musicians, cheerful voices to praise God, ears to listen, and prayers asking the Holy Spirit to guide each of us to hear God's Word so that we can go out and "make disciples of all nations, baptizing and teaching."

There are many other ways we can demonstrate our promises to the children of God...what else can you think of?
