6 MAGNOLIA MARKET AT THE SILOS / DALLAS, TEXAS / GEORGE W. BUSH PRESIDENTIAL CENTER GREENVILLE, TEXAS

This morning we leave San Antonio and continue north through Austin, stopping for lunch in Waco and a visit to Magnolia Market at the Silos. After lunch we continue to Dallas, the ninth largest city in the US and the third largest in Texas. We will visit the new George W. Bush Presidential Center which tells the story of the United States in an extraordinary time. The Bush Center's 226,000-square-foot building and 15-acre urban park reside on the campus of Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas. The museum features a piece of steel from the world Trade Center, a full-sized Oval Office, and a Texas Rose Garden. We spend the night in Greenville, Texas just northeast of Dallas.

7 MARLSGATE PLANTATION LUNCHEON AND TOUR / MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE

We depart Greenville this morning traveling to Scott, Arkansas for a delicious luncheon at the 19th century Marlsgate Plantation.
