'They kept pointing to the Asian company's name on the sign,' Tom said.

I took a shot of whiskey, jumped into my car and right to the company.

You see, this never happened before and I was very conscientious and detailed in my operation to ensure perfection at all costs. This was unacceptable.

My 'Visine' in one hand and my 'Secret' stick deodorant in the other, along with a wad of Trident in my mouth, I gingerly made it to the company.

Greeted by the tall Texan CEO with a beautiful tan Stetson cowboy hat on, I was somewhat relieved when I saw his smiling face and big, bright white teeth.

Tom stood beside him, straightfaced and solemn.

After I stretched out my hand for a shake, the two men began laughing hysterically.

Yep, they got me. True story. Apparently Tom and the CEO conspired this 'prank' on me!!! And the succeeded!

I think I aged 20 years into the future that day, one I'll never forget. Lovingly executed by both men.

After a group hug I was somewhat functional and we all enjoyed a good laugh and a great lunch.

This would truly become one of my fondest memories of Tom Walsh and his remarkable ability to follow through with a straight face in his irresistible desire to enjoy a good prank.

He was so fun, brave, loyal, lovable and respected by everyone who knew him.

A wonderful husband, father, grandfather, son and dedicated officer of our entire community, he will be greatly missed and remembered always.

High School Students Take Advantage of CCP Program to Save Thousands on College Education



Laketran Retrofits Dial-a-Ride Bus to Serve as Mobile Food Pantry

A new Mobile Food Pantry will be visiting communities throughout Lake County each week to provide fresh produce to seniors in need of food.

A retrofitted Laketran Dial-a-Ride bus, re-branded as the Lake County Mobile Food Pantry

with vehicle graphics donated by Avery Dennison, will visit two locations each week on Tuesdays and Thursdays to distribute 60 boxes of fresh produce to senior participants.

Lake County seniors, 60 years and older, may register for one Lifeline at 2-1-1 or Lake County Council on Aging at 440-205-8111.

Offering completely contactless pick up process, Laketran employees volunteers from RSVP of Lake County will place groceries in the trunk of seniors' cars as they arrive. Volunteers are equipped with PPE to ensure all participants' safety.

Similar to Laketran's produce pick-up program organized last summer with Lake County Commissioners Senior Services, RSVP of Lake County, Council on Aging and Lifeline, the agencies worked together to secure food donations from the Greater Cleveland Food Bank and each play a role in taking reservations, sorting donations and distributing the food.

The Greater Cleveland Food Bank donations are purchased through the Ohio Association of Food Banks or supplied by the USDA funded Farm to Families Food Box program that purchases farm surplus and distributes it to those in need during the pandemic.





Irruptive Birds are in Audubon's Sights

Certain bird species are spending this winter in Northeast Ohio in especially high numbers. Blackbrook Audubon Society encourages everyone to connect with these rare visitors and record them, as well as resident birds, for the Great Backyard Bird Count February 12 -15.

Common Redpolls and Evening Grosbeaks have flown here from Canadian latitudes. They are part of a group known as irruptive species. Both of these finches visit feeders and are easy to spot. Participants in the GBBC are invited to count all bird species and individuals for at least 15 minutes on one or more days that weekend, regardless of age or birding skill level. Instructions, apps and bird ID tips are available at www. birdcount.org.

Blackbrook Audubon lists popular birding spots and links on the resources page of their website, blackbrookaudubon.org. Follow Blackbrook's Facebook page for current sightings. Contribute to this international count by adding the irruptive species to your list before they head back north and before the annual spring migration begins. Blackbrook wants participants to bird safely following the current Covid-19 guidelines.

Whether counters record birds at their feeder, in a park, or any other location, submitting these numbers will enhance the snapshot of bird distribution and abundance. This will help scientists answer questions on migration patterns, spread of diseases and the effects of weather and climate change. When the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and National Audubon Society launched GBBC in 1998, they created the first online citizenscience project to collect data on wild birds and display the results in near real-time. Birds Canada joined the effort in 2009. Birds observed locally can be compared to other reports in the region with maps on the project website during and after the count.

Last February, participants in almost 200 countries counted more than 6,900 species of birds on over 260,000 checklists. Make sure the birds in your favorite spot aren't overlooked!





Heating Assistance Available-Application Deadline: May 31, 2021

Agency and the Lake County Council on Aging want to remind Ohioans that assistance is available to help with their home energy bills. The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps Ohioans at or below 175 percent of the federal poverty guidelines pay their heating

Applied directly to the customer's utility or bulk fuel bill, the benefit can help manage heating costs. Ohioans can visit www.energyhelp. ohio.gov to apply online, download

The Ohio Development Services a copy of the application or find contact information for a local Energy Assistance Provider (EAP). The Lake County Council on Aging is able to assist individuals over the phone to complete their application for HEAP benefits. If preferred, an individual can drop off their application and verifications using the agency's secure drop box for an Information & Assistance Specialist to review the application to ensure it is complete and submit on the individual's behalf. When applying, individuals need to have

copies of the following documents:

- Most recent utility bills.
- A list of all household members (including birth dates and Social Security numbers).
- Proof of income for the past 30 days for all household members (12 months for certain income types).
- Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members.
- Proof of disability (if applicable).

HEAP benefits are applied to an individual's energy bill after January 1st. **Applications for the** HEAP program must be received by May 31, 2021.

This is not an emergency program. Low-income households that have been disconnected (or have a pending disconnection notice), need to establish new service, need to pay to transfer service, have 25% (or less) of bulk fuel supply remaining, or have a household member who was diagnosed with COVID-19 in 2020 may also be eligible for the HEAP Winter Crisis Program, which

started on November 1, 2020. If vou need immediate assistance with your energy bills, please contact your local EAP. A list of providers can be found at www.energyhelp.

Applications for the HEAP Winter Crisis Program must be received by March 31, 2021. For more information on HEAP, visit www.energyhelp.ohio.gov call (800) 282-0880. Hearingimpaired customers can dial 711 for assistance.

Cyber Smarts for Older Adults

Many older adults are vulnerable to scams when using computers, tablets and smartphones. Whether using technology in public or at home, you can help protect yourself and loved ones from fraud or financial exploitation.

Here are some tips from the Ohio Attorney General's Office to help keep you safe.

Internet Tips

- Install and use a pop-up blocker. Pop-up blockers are often available free, including within some internet browsers.
- Use a secure website whenever you purchase items online. Secure web addresses begin with "https" rather than "http."
- When conducting internet searches, remember that the top search results may not always be from legitimate companies or agencies.
- To reduce security and privacy risks, log out of websites when you're finished. Wireless/Wi-Fi tips
- Verify the specific network name with the network owner before connecting to Wi-Fi.
- Never disclose personal information passwords and credit card numbers included when using a public WiFi connection.
- Assume that everyone can see what you're doing when you use a public network.
- Do not set your devices to automatically connect to any public Wi-Fi networks.

Email Tips

- Never respond to unexpected requests for your personal information, even if the sender appears to have some details about you or your account. Scammers may pretend to be your bank, your credit card company or a government agency and may ask you to confirm your account by submitting your account number, password and/or Social Security number.
- Do not click on links, open attachments or download

anything from a suspicious message, even when they appear to be from a friend or trusted source.

Social Media Tips

- When on social media, change privacy settings to meet your needs. Understand that when you leave your account "public," anyone can see information about you, including your pictures and names of your family members and friends.
- Watch out for scammers who may impersonate your social-media friends or who may tell you that they need money or unexpectedly have money to give to you.
- Imagine this: Imagine a scammer finds your social-media page. Could he or she pretend to know more about you to make a scam seem real? For instance, could the scammer pretend to know your grandchild's name is "Timmy"? Would that make a call from a scammer claiming to be "Timmy" seem more real?

Computer Maintenance

- Install and maintain an antivirus and anti-spyware program. Set the program to update automatically or check regularly for updates because new viruses are launched all the time. Do not buy protection software and services based on telephone calls, pop-up advertisements, unexpected virus warnings or email messages claiming that your device has a virus. They are probably scams.
- Visit <u>www.staysafeonline.</u> org_for a list of free security products that scan for and detect malware.

Warning Signs of Fraud or Financial Exploitation

- Requests to send money via wire transfer, gift card or prepaid money card.
 - Pressure to act immediately.
- Guarantees to make money quickly.
- Requests to keep conversations or relationships a secret
- Anti-virus scan results indicate the presence of malware or other threats on your device.

• Unexplained withdrawals from your bank account, charges to your credit card or missing cash.

• Calls regarding unpaid bills.

Common Risk Factors

- Older adults who are socially or physically isolated.
- Older adults who rely on others to handle their finances.
- Older adults who have recently lost a loved one, especially if that person handled the older adult's finances.
- Older adults who suffer from the ailments of aging, a physical or mental impairment, memory issues or other disabilities.

To Avoid Potential Financial Fraud or Exploitation Online

- Be leery of those who contact you unexpectedly, even if they say they are from a trusted organization or the government, and even if the message appears to be legitimate.
- Never give out personal information such as your Social Security number or bank account number to someone over the internet unless it's a transaction you've initiated.
- Never allow remote access to your computer from an

outside source.

- Use a complex, unique password or passphrase for each of your online accounts.
- Limit the amount and type of information you post on social media.
- Read websites and emails carefully if there are grammar mistakes, it's often the red flag of a scam.
- Always remember: If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!

To Report Fraud or Financial Exploitation

- Contact your local police department.
- Contact your local Adult Protective Services office.
- Contact the Ohio Attorney General's Office.


