PROCESSIONAL

GREETING

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

C: Amen.

P: Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

C: Hosanna to the Son of David.

CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION

P: The Word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword,

C: piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

P: Let us now come before the Lord and examine our lives in light of God's commandments as we have learned them.

Silence for reflection on God's Word and self-examination.

P: We confess together.

C: Heavenly Father, from Your First Commandment telling us that we are to give You first place in our lives, to the Tenth Commandment telling us to be content with what we have, we have sinned against all of them. With not only our deeds, but also in the thoughts of our minds, the lusts of our eyes, and the desires of our hearts we have broken Your Law. We know from Your Holy Word that You are a God of mercy and forgiveness. We ask for Your forgiveness in the name of our Savior Jesus Christ, who paid the penalty for our sin by His precious blood.

P: God has told us in His Word, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Upon this your confession, I, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen. Thanks be to God!

COLLECT

P: Let us pray. Most merciful God, as the people of Jerusalem, with palms in their hands, gathered to greet Your dearly beloved Son when He came into His Holy City, grant that we may ever hail Him as our King and, when He comes again, may go forth to meet Him with trusting and steadfast hearts and follow Him in the way that leads to eternal life; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

P: Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

C: Hosanna in the highest.

Isaiah 50:4-9a

⁴ The Lord GOD has given Me the tongue of those who are taught, that I may know how to sustain with a word him who is weary. Morning by morning he awakens; he awakens My ear to hear as those who are taught. ⁵ The Lord GOD has opened My ear, and I was not rebellious; I turned not backward. ⁶ I gave My back to those who strike, and My cheeks to those who pull out the beard; I hid not My face from disgrace and spitting. ⁷ But the Lord GOD helps Me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set My face like a flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame. ⁸ He who vindicates Me is near. Who will contend with Me? Let us stand up together. Who is My adversary? Let him come near to Me. ⁹ Behold, the Lord GOD helps Me; who will declare Me guilty?

Philippians 2:5–11

⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though He was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but made Himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

John 12:12-19

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 12th chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

¹² The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. ¹³ So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" ¹⁴ And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, ¹⁵ "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" ¹⁶ His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about Him and had been done to Him. ¹⁷ The crowd that had been with Him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised Him from the dead continued to bear witness. ¹⁸ The reason why the crowd went to meet Him was that they heard He had done this sign. ¹⁹ So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after Him."

THE LORD'S PRAYER


