When Worlds Collapse

hen personal worlds collapse, we can lose our way. The stars that marked our path through life disappear. When everything in life on which we had depended is shaken, we can feel life is not worth living. It happens when someone we love dies, when life-threatening illness lays us low. when a relationship disintegrates without warning. Then the world we once knew is no more. This week's Gospel suggests "when you see these things happening know that he is near, at the gates" (Mark 13:29). But how can that be?

I met Marguerite and Ken when I came to the parish. A short time later, I received a phone call that Ken had suffered a massive heart attack. He had gone down to the basement for something, and that was where he died. I spent some time with Marquerite, and as you

can imagine, she was wrapped in grief. They'd had a wonderful marriage, she told me, had done everything together. Whatever one did, the other went along. Two years later, Marguerite and I were talking and she began telling me how life had changed for her without Ken. She still missed him terribly. But lately she found herself involved in all sorts of parish activities and services she never would have gotten into, simply because they had always done things together. Without Ken, she found new worlds she never knew existed. For Marguerite, God had opened the gates to new life. •

Dear Padre,

I am confused by Genesis 6:6: "The LORD regretted making human beings on the earth, and his heart was grieved." How can a perfect being regret something he created in his own image?

Sometimes reading an isolated line of Scripture can be confusing. Context is essential. The Second Vatican



Council's Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation (Dei Verbum), promulgated by Pope St. Paul VI on November 18, 1965, clearly teaches this Catholic understanding of sacred Scripture. A proper appreciation of context, in the example you provided, reminds us that the holy writers of Scripture were not reporting the words of the Lord like an announcer on the evening news. This is not a newspaper account of a witnessed event or a report commenting on the scene that has unfolded. Biblical authors were constrained by their own experience and perception, even as they were inspired by the Spirit of God. When they made a conclusion, they frequently revealed more about their humanity than they did about the divinity they witnessed. The divine is just too wonderful and mysterious for humans to fully comprehend.

The author of Genesis provided a summary of how the experience of the creative activity of God was perceived. It is not the whole story and is perhaps best understood more as a contrast with Genesis 1:31, where we read that on the sixth day, "God looked at everything he had made, and found it very good." •



- 2. I know the teachers............ There are many opportunities to get to know the teachers. Class sizes are small. Once a month home and school meetings, Information on social media
- 4. We pay taxes to support the public school.......... Our Catholic Schools are supported by their parish. Bishop McKnight believes the education of parish children is a mission of that parish. Therefore the children of the parish may attend the school because their parents are supporting the mission of the church by educating them in the way of faith.
- 5. There is busing for public school.............Parents need to transport their child / children to the Catholic school. Some parents work out car pooling. To help with working parents ICS provides before school care / and after school care to make it convenient to drop off on their way to work and pick up on their way home. Also ICS provides an Early Childhood Learning Center (ECLC) for children ages 2-4. This is helpful in that the family's children can attend at one place.

- 6. Sports, my child wants to be involved in sports......Students at ICS participate in PE classes. Students in 7th and 8th grades are eligible to participate in Cross, Country, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Cheerleading and Track and Field with the Montgomery County R-II Middle School.
- 7. It's a good school..........Immaculate Conception School is also a good school. All Catholic Schools are accredited through the Missouri Nonpublic School Accrediting Association. ICS is one of the 36 Elementary schools in the Jefferson City Diocese. ICS have certified and dedicated teachers all of whom have completed the Virtus online training.
- 8. My Kids want to go there......ICS students are supported by their parents and teachers that believe in teaching Christs' core values to children. The environment is holistic in that there is academics, spiritual, social, emotional and physical development. A transfer from home to school and school to home.

Public Schools are unable to teach the Gospel values. They are unable to provide an environment that supports these values. Aside from curriculum students are also taught respect, responsibility, teamwork and social formation and are held accountable for their actions. They are also taught natural consequences and conflict resolution.

When one attends a school with small class sizes teachers can customize learning to meet the needs of their students whether enrichment or remediation.
