New Hymnal Next Week!

Next week is the first Sunday of Advent. As promised a few months ago, we are going to have a new hardback hymnal starting the first Sunday of Advent (which is next Sunday). The hymnal is called the *Saint Augustine Hymnal*. It is published by International Liturgy Publications (ILP). The advantage of this hymnal is that it contains many of the hymns that we already know. But there are also a lot of new songs that we do not know yet-songs from ILP and also other popular Catholic music publishers. This new hymnal will provide a certain level of stability with tradition while enabling us to try some new music. I am impressed with the quality of music from ILP- which publishes songs such as "This is Jesus" and "Cup of Life Outpoured." The music is both contemporary and solidly Catholic.

Advent by Candlelight is being held Sunday, December 3rd, 5 to 7PM.



This week, as I was going through old bulletins, I found an article from January 1999 explaining what RCIA was. I thought back to a few weeks ago when I overheard someone asking what exactly RCIA was. As a person who has gone through RCIA, I decided to share this story with you on this explaining what the class for converts is all about. Though simple, this class is very meaningful and important (not to mention necessary) to those who are entering the Church. Father Dwight has asked me to mention that now we have RCIA meetings that are one-on-one with him and a sponsor. This kind of mentoring system seems to be more effective. RCIA is open to anyone who is interested in studying the Faith. You do not have to be fully committed to becoming Catholic immediately. The ceremonies that will be held for the members of the class are open to the congregation. The first one will be the Right of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens for a Shippensburg University Student on November 29th at 6 PM.
