NORTH BEACH: Bob Fleming reported that everything is in good order at the beach area. Members are again reminded to please clean out the LLPOA boats used for fishing.

Lifeguards will be scheduled at No. Beach as soon as school is out.

SOUTH BEACH: Jed Burton reported that the 2 beach aerators are being repaired and will be replaced as soon as possible.

The newly restored boat storage area sustained some damage during the recent heavy storms and will be repaired.

Members expressed concerns about sewage backing up out of manholes on So. Beach, causing bacteria to seep into the lake. Our past efforts to reconstruct the drain area and put in stone continues to minimize the problem. The Village Water Dept. is aware of this problem. The Health Dept tests continue to show bacteria count below minimum levels.

NOTICE: Residents of Loch Lomond should know that the Village of Mundelein "must" find and eliminate so-called 'in-flow and infiltration' into the sewage system, caused primarily by improperly connected downspouts and sump pumps. Violators will be required to bring their properties into compliance with village code..(Chicago Tribune: Chicagoland section, March 28, 1991) This is of great importance to Loch Lomond residents. because the resulting overflow of the drainage system, in some cases, causes sewage overflow into Loch Lomond.

WATER SAFETY: Julie Adamek reported that 18 lifeguards have been hired for the 1991 season and 126 children have signed up for swim lessons. The water safety program will be operating fully by June 8.

LAKE MGT: The Lakes Mgt. Committee is pleased to welcome 2 new volunteers-- Mark Bonen and Joe Sterling.

A second bid for dredging has not been received to date and the search for a suitable disposal site for the dredged material continues. We will persevere until the desired results are achieved.

LAKE SPRAYING: Don Ferkin reported that Nick Gowe has expressed a willingness to attend a Board meeting to explain the different chemicals used for lake spraying and provide brochures for interested persons. A decision will be announced in the near future.

SECURITY: A licensed and fully insured Security Service is being used by Loch Lomond to monitor the beach areas and assure use only by dues paying members. We have significantly reduced trespassing, vandalism and safety hazard. This seems to be working out very well.

PATH: The Path has sustained serious erosion from the recent heavy storms. Repairs have been made to correct this problem. Members using the Path for walking or biking should be cautious to avoid accidents. We will study the area further to see if we can reduce the problem.
